In September 1999, Skender's and Ilaz's mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Negroc/Negrovce. In November of the same year, Ilaz's family re-interred Ilaz's mortal remains in the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Malishevë/Mališevo.

Fatos (Sherif) Krasniqi

(born 10/09/1970, Albanian from Negroc/Negrovce, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, member of KLA)

Fatos took an active part in the demonstrations against the abolition of Kosovo's autonomy. He joined the KLA in March 1998. He died on **26 September 1998** in clashes with Serb forces on Mount *Kosmaç/Kosmač* in **Negroc/Negrovce**. He was buried the following day in the cemetery in Negroc/Negrovce. Exactly a year later, Fatos's mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Negroc/Negrovce.

Sofije (Adem) Dubovci

(born 28/03/1960, Albanian woman from Čikatovë e Vjetër/Staro Čikatovo, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, two children)

Sofije lived with her husband Xheladin and sons Ylberin and Fitim [Čikatovë e Vjetër/Staro Čikatovo]. She had psychological problems and had to visit her doctor regularly. On the morning of **26 September 1998**, she left with Xheladin for Glogoc/Glogovac, to see the doctor. As they walked across the village fields, Serb police stationed in the *Feronikl* factory shot at them, hitting Sofije. She fell to the ground. Xheladin managed to escape. Sofije's family did not dare collect her body

until the end of the war. After the war, they went to the scene of the murder, but failed to find her body there. Her mortal remains were found by KFOR in 2002. Her family recovered her body on 22 February 2010 and buried her later that day in the cemetery in Gllobar/Globare.

Ljubomir (Svetislav)

Ljubomirović

(born 21/04/1966, Serb from Ljubostinjki Prnjavor, Trstenik municipality, one child, member of MUP RS)

Veljko (Predrag) Miljković

(born 16/07/1968, Serb from Kruševac, one child, member of MUP RS)

Sreten (Velibor) Milić

(born 7/01/1970, Serb from Dedina, Kruševac municipality, one child, member of MUP RS)

Ljubomir was Deputy Chief commander of the Municipal Police Department in Trstenik. Veljko had been a junior Yugoslav Army officer until 1991. In January 1993, he joined the Kruševac Police Department. Sreten also served with the Kruševac Police Department. All three men were members of the 3rd troop, 37th detachment of the Special Police Units - PJP. During 1998, their unit was deployed in the territory of Suharekë/Suva Reka. On **26 September 1998**, Ljubomir, Veljko and Sreten were with their unit on a search mission in **Tërdec/Trdevac**. During the mission, Sreten was fatally wounded, and Ljubomir and Veljko were severely wounded. Veljko died soon afterwards and Ljubomir died on the way to Prishtinë/Priština hospital. Ljubomir was laid to rest on 27 September 1998 in the cemetery in Ljubostinjki Prnjavor. Veljko was laid to rest in the Bežanijsko Old Cemetery and Sreten in the cemetery in Dedina.
