Goran (Živko) Marković

(born 5/10/1971, Serb from Prishtinë/Priština, sound engineer, two children, member of MUP RS)

Dejan, Živorad and Goran were members of the reserve component of the Serbian Ministry of the Interior. Živorad lived with his wife Nada and their children Jelena and Miloš in Bërnice e Poshtme/Donja Brnjica. He worked as an electrician at the Kosovo Railways in Fushë Kosovë/Kosovo Polje. Dejan lived with his wife and sons Nikola and Stefan in Kuršumljaja. Goran lived with his wife Ivana, daughter Bojana and son Aleksandar in Prishtinë/Priština. He worked at Prishtinë/Priština Radio Television.

On **17 October 1998**, Dejan, Živorad and Goran's unit was stationed in several abandoned Albanian houses in the *Bujupi* neighbourhood in **Arllat/Orlate**. Živorad, Dejan, Goran, Milivoje Marković and Goran Sofronijević were lodged together in one of the houses. In the evening, at around 20:00h, the KLA opened fire at them while they were in the attic. Dejan, Živorad and Goran died instantly, while the other two policemen were injured. Živorad was laid to rest on 19 October 1998 in the cemetery in Bërnice e Poshtme/Donja Brnjica. Goran was buried the same day in the Orthodox cemetery in Prishtinë/Priština. Dejan was buried on 20 October 1998 in the cemetery in Kuršumljaja.

Dragiša (Dane) Stojčević

(born 5/12/1978, Serb from Karavukovo, Ođzaci municipality, member of VJ)

Dragiša lived, with his parents, sister and grandparents, in Karavukovo. After completing a secondary school for lathe operators, he enrolled in the army to do his compulsory service. In December 1997 he was deployed to Prishtinë/Priština. He

was a tank driver with the 1st Armoured Battalion of the 15th Armoured Brigade. On 23 October 1998, his family was informed that he had lost his life near *Kroi i Mbretit/Careva česma (Emperor's Font)* in **Korroticë e Epërme/Gornja Koretica**. The family subsequently found out from Miljan, Dragiša's fellow soldier, that Dragiša and Miljan had separated from their unit on **22 October 1998**, after which they were captured by some KLA members in a forest. Then someone opened fire on these KLA members, who fired back on Dragiša and Miljan, killing Dragiša instantly and wounding Miljan. Dragiša's family collected his body on 24 October 1998 and had him buried the next day in Karavukovo.

Shemsi (Rashit) Elshani

(born 3/12/1987, Albanian from Krajkovë/Krajkovo, Gllugoc/Glogovac municipality, primary school student)

Shemsi, 11, lived with his parents Rashit and Hasime and brother Dardan in **Krajkovë/Krajkovo**. In the same house lived his uncle Bahtiar with his wife and children. On the morning of **24 October 1998**, Shemsi, his father and his cousin Adem went up into the woods above their house to cut some wood. All of a sudden, Serb forces opened fire from the direction of Mount *Potork*. Shemsi was hit and died instantly. His family buried him on 26 October 1998 in the Krajkovë/Krajkovo cemetery.
