

Xhafer also went to work. A few hours later, gunshots were heard coming from the direction of the transformer station. Immediately afterwards, the police blocked the access to the facility. Later that day, the Serbian Ministry of the Interior communicated that police officer Xhafer Qorri and two workers, Nazim Mulaj and Brahim Musliu, had been shot dead in a KLA attack on the transformer station. However, Nazim and Brahim's family were told that Brahim and Nazif had died when Serb policemen had killed Xhafer Qorri. The police took Xhafer's, Nazif's and Brahim's bodies to the hospital in Prishtinë/Priština for autopsies. Their respective families collected their bodies on 12 December

1998. Nazif was buried in the cemetery in the *Mulaj* neighbourhood, Tërstenik/Trstenik; Brahim was buried in his native village of Shterubullovoë/Štrbulovo; and Xhafer was buried in the cemetery in the *Qorra*i neighbourhood in Glllogoc/Glogovac. After the war, on 23 October 2000, Nazif's family transferred his mortal remains to the Cemetery for War Victims in Tërstenik/Trstenik.
