Haxhi (Nekë) Alija

(born 13/07/1933, Albanian from Kodrali/Kodralija, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, six children)

Halil (Haxhi) Alija

(born 12/08/1975, Albanian from Kodrali/Kodralija, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, member of KLA)

Haxhi lived with his wife Elmije, sons Halil and Avni and Avni's family. Halil had completed secondary school and lived by farming. He joined the KLA at its local headquarters in Kodrali/Kodralija on 20 May 1998. On hearing that Serb forces were moving towards the village in the early morning of **3 September 1998**, the villagers, including Haxhi and his family, left their homes and gathered in a field. Halil went to join the men defending the village. Serb forces entered the village and surrounded the villagers gathered in the field. Serb policemen and soldiers then separated out several men and beat them in front of the others. When Halil's father Haxhi protested, they started to beat him too. After two hours, they let the people go. Most of the villagers took shelter in the village of Bec. Haxhi died later that day as a result of serious injuries sustained. He was buried at the Bec cemetery. Three days later, Halil's brother was told by his uncle Imer that Halil had been killed on 3 September 1998, after Serb forces had entered **Kodrali/Kodralija**. The uncle had found Halil's body on the meadow called *Te vera*, and buried him the same day at the cemetery in Kodrali/Kodralija.

Ali (Hazir) Kalimashi

(born 12/04/1961, Albanian from Kodrali/Kodralija, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, worker, five children, member of KLA)

Ali worked at the *Erenik* factory. On 20 May 1998, he joined the KLA in his village. Ali left his home with his family on **3 September 1998**, when Serb forces surrounded the village. They joined other locals who had gathered in a field [**Kodrali/Kodralija**]. Around 09:00h, seeing Serb forces approaching the field, Ali split from his family. The following day, Ali's brother Dervish found Ali's body on a meadow known as *Livadhet e Rashkocit*. Dervish and Ismet, Ali's other brother, buried Ali with the help of some locals, in the yard of their family residence. After the war, on 29 July 1999, the Kalimashis transferred Ali's mortal remains to the village cemetery.

Fehmi (Imer) Berisha

(born 22/12/1970, Albanian from Rogovë/Rogovo, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, two children, member of KLA)

Fehmi joined the KLA on 26 April 1998, together with his brother Nesret and some relatives. He fought Serb forces on the outskirts of Rahovec/Orahovac in July 1998. Fehmi was wounded on **3 September 1998** in **Rogovë/Rogovo**, on his way back from Albania. His comrades transported him to the KLA field hospital in Krushë e Madhe/Velika Kruša [Rahovec/Orahovac municipality], where he succumbed to his wounds on 6 September 1998. He was buried in his native village of Rogovë/Rogovo.

Smajl (Sadri) Ahmeti

(born 10/10/1925, Albanian from Kralan/Kraljane, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, retired army officer, three children)

Serb forces again attacked the village of **Kralan/Kraljane** on **4 September 1998**. Villagers started fleeing. Smajl stayed at home, whilst his sons Sadri and Shaban took their mother Kaje with their respective families and fled the village. Shaban returned the following day and found his father's body some 200 metres from the house. He
