### Božo (Milutin) Džuver

(born 7/01/1976, Montenegrin from Podgorica, electro-technician, member of the Yugoslav Army - VJ)

Božo lived with his parents Milutin and Milijana, brother Željko and sister Vera, in Proleterska Street in Podgorica [Montenegro]. After completing electro-technical school, he wanted to study literature, but in the meantime went to do his military service at the end of 1997, first to Novi Sad, then to Bela Crkva. He was trained for operating *praga* combat vehicles. One night in the summer of 1998, Božo's unit was transferred to Kosovo. When, on **8 September 1998**, the unit stopped in the village of **Jabllanicë/Jablanica** to have lunch, a shell landed near Božo, leaving him seriously wounded in the stomach. Two hours later he succumbed to his wounds. His family buried him on 10 September 1998 at the Zagorić cemetery in Podgorica.

### Driton (Mujë) Zeneli – Faton

(born 31/05/1972, Albanian from Jabllanicë/Jablanica, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, teacher, two children, member of KLA)

Before the war, Driton worked two years as an aviation technician at the military airport in Podgorica [Montenegro]. After that, he returned to Kosovo, completed Teacher Training College and started working as a mathematics teacher in the villages of Doblbarë/Doblbare and Dol/Dolj. He joined the KLA on 5 April 1998. He was tasked with the training of new soldiers in the village of Gllogjan/Glodane [Dečan/Dečani municipality]. In August he was appointed commander of the local KLA

headquarters in **Jabllanicë/Jablanica**. At the beginning of September 1998, Driton was holding position near the spot known as *Pika e Shqiponjës/Orlovo gnezdo* (*Eagle's Nest*). He died on **8 September 1998** of a tank projectile during a fighting between the KLA and Serb forces. Serb forces transported his body by helicopter to an unknown location. On 20 June 1999, Driton's mortal remains were discovered in the Pejë/Peć town cemetery. He was buried the same day in the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Jabllanicë/Jablanica.

### Dinë (Miftar) Çekaj

(born 13/03/1951, Albanian from Irzniq/Rznić, Dečan/Dečani municipality, professor, four children, member of KLA)

Dinë joined the KLA on 24 April 1998. He was stationed in his home village of Irzniq/Rznić. On 8 September 1998, Dinë went to **Skivjan/Skivjane** to see his wife Nushe and their children, who had fled there for safety. The following day, **9 September 1998**, in the afternoon, he left for Irzniq/Rznić. Shortly afterwards, his family heard shooting, and a neighbour rushed to them saying that Serb forces had killed Dinë in a field near Skivjan/Skivjane. Owing to the presence of Serb forces, none of the family or villagers dared to go to the scene and retrieve the body. The following day, Nushe's brother recovered Dinë's body from the morgue in Gjakovë/Đakovica. Dinë was buried later that day at the Skivjan/Skivjane cemetery. After the war, in 2000, Dinë's remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Irzniq/Rznić.
