

stayed home. When the husband returned home, Aferdita was gone. Her fate remained unknown until 8 December 1998, when Serb police found her body at the place known as *Podi i Geshtenjave/Dolina kestenova (Chestnuts Valley)*, in the nearby village of Rakoc. She had been killed by a shot to the head, and her eyes were blindfolded. Her body was covered with wood, and a bottle of gasoline was lying next to it. The Deputy-Commander of the KLA headquarters for the *Dukagjin/Dukadini* area, Nazmi Brahimaj, recorded in his war diary: “The villagers assume that Aferdita was killed by Lieutenant Idriz“. Aferdita was buried by her family at the Pejë/Peć cemetery.

Sadedin (Hysen) Shehu

(born 16/02/1958, Albanian from Gjakovë/Đakovica, worker, three children, member of KLA)

Sadedin had worked at the *Dukagjini* firm in Gjakovë/Đakovica until 1991, when he moved with his wife and children, first to Belgium, and then to Germany. In June 1998, Sadedin returned from Germany and joined the KLA in the village of Gillogjan/Glođane. On **19 November 1998**, Sadedin and four other KLA members attempting to cross the border at *Boka e Deves/Devino brdo [Devë/Deva]* ran into a minefield. Sadedin was killed and the other men were injured. Sadedin's body has never been found. He is listed on the ICRC list of missing persons under ICRC Nr BLG-804729-01.

Agim (Sadri) Ibrahim

(born 7/06/1950, Albanian from Gjakovë/Đakovica, taxi driver, three children)

In August 1998, Agim was arrested on suspicion of being a KLA member. He was kept eight days in police detention in

Gjakovë/Đakovica, where he was severely beaten. He recovered from his injuries and went back to work. On **20 November 1998**, around 15:00h, Agim went to work at the taxi station next to the bus station in Gjakovë/Đakovica, and has never been seen since. He is still unaccounted for. Agim is listed on the ICRC list of missing persons under BLG-804289-01.

Isuf (Tahir) Olluri

(born 2/07/1959, Albanian from Rakovinë/Rakovina, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, farmer, four children, member of KLA)

Isuf worked on the Fushë Kosovë/Kosovo Polje - Prizren railroad line from 1983 until 1995, when he was fired. From then on, he lived by farming. In September 1996, Serb police searched his house and found a gun. They took Isuf and his brother Osman to the police station in Gjakovë/Đakovica, and ill-treated them while trying to get them to confess to possession of a rifle. On 20 April 1998, Isuf joined the KLA. On **25 November 1998**, while on the way back from Gjakovë/Đakovica, Isuf was ambushed by Serb police in **Rakovinë/Rakovina**, and killed on the spot.

Driton (Halit) Zeqiri

(born 20/08/1988, Albanian boy from Nivokaz, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, primary school student)

Driton and his sister Hidajete, three years his senior, were taken away from the village of Nivokaz by their parents because of frequent attacks by Serb forces. They all moved temporarily to Gjakovë/Đakovica, where they stayed in the house of Bujar Hoda. Their father Halit would return to the village whenever the situation calmed down, and the children would come to visit him there. **8 December 1998** was no different: Halit was in Nivokaz, and his children had come via **Moliq/Molić** to
