

stood next to a forest, at the periphery of the village [**Dush i Vogël/Dušević**]. In the spring of 1998, Oliver had finished at a school for construction millwrights and started working in the grocery shop at the agricultural cooperative in Klinë/Klina. Because the Albanians suddenly abandoned the village on 20 June 1998, Oliver and his brother and mother went to Klinë/Klina, and stayed the night there. On the morning of **21 June 1998**, they heard their village was calm, so they returned home. At about 13:00h, while the men defending the village were having lunch in their house, they heard shooting. Oliver and the other men ran out of the house in search of cover. Some 30 metres from the house, Oliver was shot by a sniper in the chest. His family buried him the next day in the cemetery in Klinë/Klina.

Skender (Ymer) Ademi

(born 3/10/1947, Albanian from Drenoc/Drenovac, Klinë/Klina municipality, miner, seven children, member of KLA)

Before the war, Skender had lived and worked in Switzerland. In April 1998, he returned to his village and became a member of the KLA. He died on **28 June 1998** in clashes with Serb forces in his native village of **Drenoc/Drenovac**. On 30 June 1998, after the clashes had stopped, some KLA members discovered his body in a field above his house. They buried him later that day in the village cemetery. Later on, Serb forces exhumed the body and took it to an unknown location. On 24 January 2005, Skenders' family were called by the Forensic Medicine Institute in Rahovec/Orahovac to collect his mortal remains. Skender was buried in the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in the place called *Kodra e Kuqe/Crveni Breg (Red Hill)* in

Grabanicë/Grabanica.

Man (Gjele) Rexhepi

(born 20/04/1914, Albanian from Drenoc/Drenovac, Klinë/Klina municipality, farmer, seven children)

The aged Man fled Drenoc/Drenovac with his family on **28 June 1998**, because of ongoing clashes between the KLA and Serb forces in the village. When they arrived in the adjacent village of Grabanicë/Grabanica, Man decided to go back home [**Drenoc/Drenovac**]. Some KLA members saw him arrive home. On 30 June 1998, Man's family heard through the press that Man had been killed and that his body had been thrown into the well belonging to the Hajdari family. When the Rexhepis returned to the village after the war, they looked for Man's body everywhere, with no success. His fate has not been clarified to date. Man has been registered on the ICRC list of missing persons under BLG-803875-01.

Grujica (Milosav) Šmigić

(born 16/10/1972, Serb from Dresnik/Drnsnik, Klinë/Klina municipality)

The KLA attacked the Serb population in **Dresnik/Drnsnik** on Saint Vitus's Day i.e. **28 June 1998**. Grujica and other Serbs organised the defence. At one point, Grujica ran out of ammunition, so he made his way into his house to fetch some. As he came out through the front door, he was hit by a sniper and died immediately.
