

Ranoc/Ranovac. The Colajs searched for their missing family members, with no success. It was only in March 2005 that they found out that Bardhec's and Nikë's mortal remains had been discovered in the village of Leskoc/Leskovac in December 2003. The Colajs collected the mortal remains on 7 April 2005 and buried them later that day in the cemetery in Zllakuqan/Zlokuçane.

### Radovan (Aleksa) Stepić

(born 23/10/1959, Serb from Drenoc/Drenovac, Klinë/Klina municipality)

Radovan lived in Drenoc/Drenovac. On **11 August 1998**, at around 14:30h, Radovan and Vladimir Stašić were shot at from nearby houses as they walked through the *Muhaxheri/Muhadžeri* neighbourhood [**Drenoc/Drenovac**]. Radovan was shot fatally and Vladimir was seriously injured. An investigating judge from District Court of Pejë/Peć came and conducted an on-site investigation. Radovan was buried by his family in Drenoc/Drenovac.

### Miroslav (Spaso) Klačnja

(born 27/06/1963, Serb from Belgrade, member of MUP RS)

Miroslav completed secondary school of economics and a police training course. After that, he worked as a traffic policeman in Belgrade. Miroslav was deployed to Kosovo in the summer of 1998, and killed on **19 August 1998** in **Cerrovikë/Cerovik** while patrolling this village. He was buried in Belgrade.

### Gjon (Lush) Prenaj

(born 5/06/1922, Albanian from Cerrovikë/Cerovik, Klinë/Klina municipality, worker, six children)

Before July 1998, Gjon and his family had left Cerrovikë/Cerovik several times and returned there after the danger had passed. In late July 1998, the Prenajs again fled Serb attacks, but this time Gjon remained in the village and joined his family in Murgë/Murga [Skënderaj/Srbica municipality] two or three weeks later. On 14 August 1998, Gjon returned to **Cerrovikë/Cerovik** with his wife Leze and a group of elderly villagers to celebrate the religious feast of *Zoja e Berishes*. Several days later, a policeman was killed in the village [see record above], as a result of which Serb forces entered the village. They torched the houses, including that of Gjon, so Gjon and Leze had to live in their yard. On **24 August 1998**, Gjon noticed that Serb forces were doing something with an excavator in the nearby *Bashota* neighbourhood, so he climbed to the second floor of his house to see what was going on. As soon as he got there, he was shot dead with a single bullet to the head. The next day, KLA members and the Prenajs' neighbours buried Gjon on the Çabiq/Čabić hill above the village. After the war, on 27 June 1999, Gjon's remains were transferred to the cemetery in Cerrovikë/Cerovik.

### Nife (Fetah) Merlaku

(born 25/08/1950, Albanian woman from Gremnik/Grebnik, Klinë/Klina municipality, 11 children)

Nife and her family fled Gremnik/Grebnik on 13 May 1998, and found refuge with Isuf Gashi in Qupevë/Čupevo, where they stayed three months. On **25 August 1998**, Serb forces shelled **Qupevë/Čupevo**. Nife was in the yard near the well, when a grenade went off nearby her, leaving her seriously injured. Her husband Sadik rushed her to
