Tefik (Habib) Vuniqi

(born 13/03/1982, Albanian from Vërshec/Vrševe, Lipjan/Lipljan municipality, secondary school student)

On **17 July 1998**, Serb forces started shelling **Vërshec/Vrševe** from Mount *Golesh/Goleš*. Tefik and his family decided to flee. While the other household members were packing up their belongings, Tefik walked off to the woods alone. A grenade went off near him, killing him instantly. His family buried him on 18 July 1998 in the cemetery in the *Mziu* neighbourhood in Vërshec/Vrševe. After the war, in March 2000, Tefik's mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for War Victims in Vërshec/Vrševe.

Muharrem (Hamit) Çadraku

(born 19/06/1943, Albanian from Vërshec/Vrševe, Lipjan/Lipljan municipality)

Muharrem lived with his brother Haradin and Haradin's family in Vërshec/Vrševe. Haradin left the village with his family on **17 July 1998**, while Muharrem stayed in the house. He was sick. His brother never saw him alive again. One month later, Haradin was informed by the ICRC that this organisation had found Muharrem's body in **Vërshec/Vrševe** and transferred it to the morgue in Prishtinë/Priština. Haradin recovered Muharrem's body and he and the rest of the family buried him in Ribar i Madh/Veliko Ribare. After the war, in March 2000, they transferred his body to the cemetery in Vërshec/Vrševe.

Goran (Đorde) Živić

(born 25/08/1969, Serb from Lipjan/Lipljan, security guard)

Goran worked as a security guard at the *Obilić* Thermal power Plant. He lived with his two brothers in **Lipjan/Lipljan**. On **21 July 1998**, he went to the green market. Having finished his shopping, he stopped in at the coffee shop owned by Novica Baždarević, after which he disappeared without trace. Goran's sister was told by an unknown woman living near the Infirmary in Lipjan/Lipljan that Goran had been forced into a car by three men, despite his struggling, and that his groceries were left strewn across the street, along with his plastic slippers. Goran is registered on the ICRC list of missing persons under YUK-050053-01.

Ismail (Gani) Bërbatovci

(born 15/04/1959, Albanian from Dobrajë e Madhe/Velika Dobranja, Lipjan/Lipljan municipality, journalist, two children)

Ismail was a professor of Albanian Language and Literature and the Editor-in-Chief of the *Fjala jonë* (*Our Word*) magazine. He visited the KLA local headquarters frequently. On 17 July 1998, Ismail went to the KLA headquarters in **Blinajë/Lipovica**. A week later, on **23 July 1998**, he went to a previously arranged meeting with Rama Buja, a member of the operational zone General Staff. Two days later, his family was told by a resident of Dobrajë e Madhe/Velika Dobranja that Ismail had been detained at the KLA headquarters and that he would be released shortly. Ismail's fate has remained unknown to date. His disappearance was registered on the ICRC list of missing persons under YUK-050089-01.
