

Haradinaj managed to escape. All three men came there to help evacuate children from the school building. Himë died later that day, near the *Liqeni i Radoniqit/Radonjičko jezero (Radoniq Lake)*, at the place called *Suka e Biteshit* from a missile fired from an airplane. Himë Haradinaj's body was found by locals from Shaptelj/Šaptelj, who informed the KLA of it. KLA transferred the body to Gillogjan/Glodane. Police transported Gazmend's and Agron's body to the morgue in Gjakovë/Đakovica where they were taken over by Gazmend's father.

Miodrag (Milorad) Otović

(born 7/05/1962, Serb from Gillogjan/Glodane, Deçan/Dečani municipality, two children, member of MUP RS)

Miodrag was head of a sector at the Deçan/Dečane police department. He lived with his family in Gillogjan/Glodane. On **24 March 1998**, Miodrag went with his three colleagues to visit the Serb family Stojanović in Dubravë/Dubrava, which was his routine daily activity. As they were driving past **Gillogjan/Glodane**, they came across two Albanians on the road and ordered them to halt. Both men started to run. Two policemen started to chase one of them, and the other man threw a hand grenade at Miodrag and Dragoslav Vukićević who stayed by the car. They immediately ran after him, but the heavy shooting from a nearby house that ensued killed Miodrag on the spot.

Milovan (Vidak) Vlahović

(born 5/08/1935, Serb from Ratish i Epërm/Gornji Ratiš, Deçan/Dečani municipality, pensioner, six children)

Milka (Radun Marković)

(born 5/05/1933, Serb woman from Ratish i Epërm/Gornji Ratiš, Deçan/Dečani municipality, housewife, six children)

Milica (Vukoje) Radunović

(born 7/07/1938, Serb woman from Dashinoc/Dašinovac, Deçan/Dečani municipality, housewife, three children)

Milovan and Milka Vlahović lived in **Ratish i Epërm/Gornji Ratiš** with their daughter Nada and sons Novak and Milojića. On the morning of **21 April 1998**, a group of armed Albanians, some wearing uniforms, entered the village, shooting. Around 15:00h, Nada, Novak and Milojića fled the village, leaving Milovan and Milka in the house, in the company of Milica Radunović, who had fled from Dashinoc/Dašinovac earlier that day. That was the last time Milovan, Milka and Milica were seen alive.

In mid-September 1998, Milovan's children recognised their father's clothes among clothes from bodies found in the canal of the *Liqeni i Radoniqit/Radonjičko jezero (Radoniq Lake)*, which were being exhibited at the *Paštrik* hotel in Gjakovë/Đakovica. On 18 September 1998, a body was handed over to Milovan's family which they were told was Milovan's, and it was buried in the cemetery in Pejë/Peć. When the body was exhumed in June 2006, a DNA analysis showed that it was not Milovan's. His disappearance was registered on the ICRC list of missing persons under BLG-805022-01.

Milka's body was positively identified in October 2004. It was exhumed from a mass grave in the village of Piskotë/Piskot [Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality] containing unidentified bodies that had been fo-
