Sadik (Osman) Morina

(born 1929, Albanian from Astrazup/Ostrozub, Malishevë/Mališevo municipality, farmer, six children)

In July 1998, Sadik's home was a shelter to some 60 people who had fled from the nearby villages. But they all had to flee Sadik's house on 27 July 1998, when Serb forces started shelling Astrazup/Ostrozub. They went to Panorc/Ponorac. On 7 **September 1998**, Sadik and his cousin Ahmet went to **Astrazup/Ostrozub** to check whether their houses were still standing. They agreed to stay in the village for a short while and, after that, to meet on the mountain above the village, at the place called *Kroni i Canit/Caniev izvor (Cani's Spring)*. At the agreed time, Ahmet headed for *Kroni i Canit/Caniev izvor*. Having seen members of Serb forces there, he fled. Two weeks later, on 20 September 1998, a village resident, Vesel Morina, found Sadik's body near *Kroni i Canit/Caniev izvor*. He had been killed with one shot to the head. Later that day, Sadik's brother Gani, Ahmet, Ahmet's brother Fejze and Vesel Morina carried his body to Joviq/Jović and buried it there in a field. After the war, on 18 October 1999, Sadik's mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for War Victims in Dragobil/ Dragobilje.

Mihrije (Mahmut) Vrenezi

(born 15/06/1919, Albanian woman from Marali/Maralija, Malishevë/Mališevo municipality, housewife, four children)

Mihrije lived with her son Aziz and his family. Their house was located in a neighbourhood that was rather isolated from

the rest of **Marali/Maralija**. In September 1998, Serb forces were in Dragobil/Dragobilje. On the afternoon of **9 September 1998**, they started shelling Marali/Maralija. At about 22:00h, a shell landed near Aziz's house, fragments of which killed Mihrije, who was on the balcony at that moment. With the help of some fellow villagers, Aziz buried his mother the same night in the cemetery in Marali/Maralija.

Mirush (Kurtish) Dakaj

(born 1/01/1962, Albanian from Cerrovikë/Cerovik, Klinë/Klina municipality, student, member of KLA)

Mirush joined the KLA in early 1998. He was known among his fellow soldiers by the nickname of Komandant Korbi. On **11 September 1998**, Mirush went with his brother Nuredin, Arben Maloku and several other soldiers to the Primary School in **Golluboc/Golubovac**, where they were to administer aid to the local residents. Serb forces opened fire at them, fatally wounding Mirush. His fellow KLA members buried him later that day in the Murgë/Murga village cemetery [Skënderaj/Srbica municipality]. After the war, in October 1999, Mirush's family transferred his mortal remains to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Grabanicë/Grabanica [Klinë/Klina municipality].

Zoran (Svetomir) Vasiljević

(born 14/02/1970, Serb from Kragujevac, one child, member of MUP RS)

Zoran served as a police officer at the Kragujevac Police Department. As of 1990, he was often deployed to Kosovo. On the night of **18 September 1998**, at around 21:00h, he and a group of policemen were lodging in an abandoned Albanian house in **Astrazup/Ostrozub**. He was accidentally killed at the hands of a fellow policeman. His family buried him on 20 September 1998 in
