Bali (Shaqir) Morina

(born 21/06/1946, Albanian from Golluboc/Golubovac, Malishevë/Mališevo municipality, farmer, seven children)

Serb forces attacked Golluboc/Golubovac on 25 September 1998. Bali hastily packed some food and clothes for the children and led his family into the woods of neighbouring Tërdec/Trdevac [Glllogoc/Glogovac municipality]. In the evening, when the shooting had stopped, Bali went back to the village to feed the cattle and get more supplies. Then he returned to the woods. Next day, **26 September 1998**, he set off again for the village. That was the last time his family saw him alive. His wife Sevdije remained a further three days in the woods with the children, and then returned to the village. She then heard that a relative, Haki, had found Bali's body in Hasan Morina's meadow [**Golluboc/Golubovac**]. There were wounds on the body that had been inflicted by a firearm. They buried Bali on 30 September 1998 in Hasan Morina's meadow. After the war, on 12 September 1999, Bali's mortal remains were removed to the Cemetery for War Victims in Pllaqicë/ Pločica.

Hamzë (Riza) Morina

(born 17/02/1945, Albanian from Golluboc/Golubovac, Malishevë/Mališevo municipality, farmer, five children)

Hamz lived with his family of nine in the Morina neighbourhood of Golluboc/Golubovac. They made their living by farming and livestock breeding. In 1998, Serb forces were stationed in the hills above the village of Kijevë/Kijevo and were repeatedly shelling Golluboc/Golubovac. As a result, Hamz's family left the village. On 25 September 1998, Hamz took his family to the neighbouring village of Vuçak/Vučak [Glllogoc/Glogovac] for safety. On the evening of **26 September 1998**, Hamz was on his way back to **Golluboc/Golubovac** to let the cattle out. Three days later, his sons Enver and Xhafer, worried about their father, went looking for him. They found Hamz's body in a ditch inside the wood near Golluboc/Golubovac. Knife cuts and indications of beatings were visible on his body. They buried him later that day in a meadow in the village. After the war, on 21 September 1999, the Morinas transferred Hamz's body to the Cemetery for War Victims in Pllaqicë/Pločica.

Riza (Riza) Maloku

(born 1931, Albanian from Pllaqicë/Pločica, Malishevë/Mališevo municipality, farmer, six children)

In late August 1998, Riza's family fled Pllaqicë/Pločica and took shelter in the wood by the village of Golluboc/Golubovac. Only Riza and his wife Vahide stayed behind in their house. When Serb forces entered Pllaqicë/Pločica on 25 September 1998, Riza and Vahide also fled the village and joined the rest of their family. The following afternoon [**26 September 1998**], the couple decided to return to **Pllaqicë/Pločica**. In their yard, they found a group of members of the Serb forces, who immediately started harassing Riza. Vahide managed to escape. Three days later, after the Serb forces had left Pllaqicë/Pločica, Riza's
