

ker and headed towards the forest. At around 16:00h, Fetah's son and daughter returned to the village to fetch some food. Near their house, they found their father's body. Fetah was buried on 19 September 1998 in a field near the house. On 20 September 1998, the family transferred the body to the cemetery in Kaçandoll/Kaçandol.

Later that day, some cousins found the body of Jashar, Fetah's son, some 300 metres from Fetah's house. No one saw Jashar come back to the village or knew when he was killed. He was buried later that day in the cemetery along with his father.

Ramadan (Sefer) Behrami

(born 23/06/1940, Albanian from Kaçandoll/Kaçandol, Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality, farmer, 12 children, member of KLA)

Musa (Selim) Begu

(born 19/10/1969, Albanian from Kaçandoll/Kaçandol, Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality, member of KLA)

Ramadan and Musa died on **15 September 1998** fighting Serb forces in Kaçandoll/Kaçandol. Their bodies were found by Fadil Jonuzi, Ramadan's cousin, at the place called *Majat e Shtizës/Oštro koplje (Sharp Spear)* [Kaçandoll/Kaçandol]. Ramadan and Musa were laid to rest in the Kaçandoll/Kaçandol cemetery on 26 September.

Elez (Elez) Begu

(born 3/03/1943, Albanian from Kaçandoll/Kaçandol, Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality, miner, five children, member of KLA)

Before the war, Elez had worked at the *Trepça* Mining Complex and lived in Kaçandoll/Kaçandol with his wife and two sons. He joined the KLA in 1997. At the time when Serb forces attacked **Kaçandoll/Kaçandol** on **15 September 1998**, Elez was in the village with his unit. His body was found by his son Riad,

who entered the village with his unit on 19 September 1998, after the Serb forces had left. He buried his father later that day near their house. After the war, in April 2000, Elez' body was transferred to and buried with military honours in the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Kaçandoll/Kaçandol.

Xhafer (Lam) Ajvazi

(born 20/05/1940, Albanian from Podujevë/Podujevo, teacher, six children)

Muhamet (Mehmet) Fazliu

(born 15/06/1962, Albanian from Dumnicë e Poshtme/Donja Dubnica, Podujevë/Podujevo municipality, car mechanic, three children)

Ejup (Idriz) Sejdiu

(born 14/08/1962, Albanian from Dobratin/Dobrotin, Podujevë/Podujevo municipality, worker, one child)

Rrahim (Bejtë) Ramadani

(born 19/02/1982, Albanian from Dobratin/Dobrotin, Podujevë/Podujevo municipality, secondary school student)

Xhafer lived with his family near the brick factory in Podujevë/Podujevo. As a teacher, he had worked in many villages in the Podujevë/Podujevo municipality. From 1977, he worked at the Employment Office in Podujevë/Podujevo. On the morning of **15 September 1998**, from his terrace Xhafer saw houses in flames in his native village of Dobratin/Dobrotin. At about 11:00h, Xhafer left in his *Golf* for Dobratin/Dobrotin, to help his brother Sefer and Sefer's family leave the village.

On the same September day, Ejup Sejdiu and Muhamet Fazliu set off from Dumnicë e Poshtme/Donja Dubnica in Muhamet's red *Ascona* and headed for Dobratin/Dobrotin, in order to get Ejup's mother Nurije out of that village. On the way to Dobratin/Dobrotin they came across Rrahim Ramadani, a boy from Dobratin/Dobrotin, and gave him a lift.

After Serb forces had retreated from Kaçandoll/Kaçandol and Dobratin/Dobrotin, the burned bodies of Xhafer, Muhamet, Ejup and Rrahim were found inside Fehmi Rekalii's house in the *Lepaja* neig-
