

A few days later, Daut Krasniqi, a KLA member, told Fejzullah's family that he had found Fejzullah's body near the place called *Dushkajë/Duška* in the forest near the village, and buried him with the help of his comrades in the cemetery of the *Krasniqi (Mexhuani)* neighbourhood. Daut said the body was riddled with gunshot wounds. After the war, some time in July 1999, Fejzullah's sons transferred their father's body to the Cemetery for War Victims in Siboc/Sibovac.

Ahmet (Hajriz) Kelmendi

(born 1956, Albanian from Siboc/Sibovac, Obiliq/Obilić municipality, locksmith, two children)

Serb forces entered Siboc/Sibovac on 26 September 1998, between 18:00 and 19:00h, and started torching the houses in

the *Kelmendi* neighbourhood. Ahmet and his father were at home at the time, whereas Ahmet's wife and two children had fled to a forest before the Serb forces entered the village. In an attempt to escape from Serb soldiers, Ahmet's father was hit by shell fragments in the arm. He returned home and Ahmet dressed his wound. The next day [27 September 1998], shells began landing around the Kelmendis' house, and Ahmet and his father decided to flee. Just as they were leaving, a grenade landed on the house [**Siboc/Sibovac**], leaving Ahmet seriously wounded from shrapnel. He fell to the ground, unable to join his father, who managed to reach the forest. Some KLA members found Ahmet's body eight days later [5 October 1998], and buried him near his house. In September 1999, Ahmet's mortal remains were transferred to the village cemetery.
