Selmon (Zhujë) Morina

(born 10/05/1940, Albanian from Loxhë/Loda, Pejë/Peć municipality, merchant, eight children)

Rexhë (Haxhi) Morina

(born 22/07/1962, Albanian from Loxhë/Loda, Pejë/Peć municipality, worker, six children)

In early July 1998, local residents of **Loxhë/Loda**, including the families of Selmon and Rexhë, left this village. Selmon and Rexhë stayed behind, together with some KLA members, in order to defend the village. On **11 July 1998** Serb forces attacked the KLA. Selmon, Rexhë and five village residents were hiding in a trench near Haxhi Salih's house. At about 11:00h a shell hit the trench, killing Selmon and Rexhë and wounding the other men. Selmon's wife returned to the village after dark, and she and several KLA members buried Selmon and Rexhë in the village cemetery. A monument was erected marking the place where the two men were killed.

Istref (Ymer) Krasniqi

(born 10/09/1933, Albanian from Turjakë/Turjak, Pejë/Peć municipality, farmer, ten children)

Nurije (Ramiz) Krasniqi

(born 18/08/1942, Albanian woman from Turjakë/Turjak, Pejë/Peć municipality, housewife, ten children)

Istref and his wife Nurije lived in their family house in **Turjakë/Turjak**. Some time around midnight on **12 July 1998**, four KLA members wearing uniforms came to Istref's house. They told the Krasniqis that they had been ordered by a KLA commander [his name is known to the HLC] to bring them in to the local KLA headquarters in Glllogjan/Glođan [Deçan/Deçani municipality] and that they would bring them back home afterwards. Istref and Nurije have never been seen again.

Their son Imer went the following day to the KLA headquarters in Vranoc/Vranovac, where they said they would inquire about his parents' whereabouts and that he should come back the next day. When he came back the next day, he was informed that his parents had disappeared without trace after being released from the KLA headquarters in Glllogjan/Glođan on 13 July 1998. Their bodies were discovered on 12 September 1998 in ***Liqeni i Radoniqit/Radonjičko jezero (Radoniq Lake)***. Post-mortem examinations determined that Nurije and Istref were killed with a firearm. Following a DNA-based identification, Istref's and Nurije's bodies were handed over to the Krasniqi family on 27 October 2006. Istref and Nurije were buried on 27 October 2006 in the cemetery in Turjakë/Turjak.

Velizar (Stoša) Stošić

(born 11/02/1935, Serb from Bellopojë/Belo Polje, Pejë/Peć municipality, pensioner, three children)

At about 16:30h on **18 July 1998**, Velizar went on his bicycle to check on his land, located near the village of Loxhë/Loda, but never came back. The next day, his family reported him missing to the police. A month later, the police informed them that they had found Velizar's bicycle on his estate. In early September 1998, Velizar's body was discovered in the ***Liqeni i Radoniqit/Radonjičko jezero (Radoniq Lake)*** canal. The DNA-based identification performed by the forensics of the Republic of Serbia determined that one of the bodies was that of Velizar Stošić. An autopsy performed on his body established that Velizar was killed with a firearm. Velizar's mortal remains were buried by his family in the cemetery in Bellopojë/Belo Polje.
