

stopped by policemen keeping watch outside Naim's room. They first checked their ID cards and wanted to proceed with a frisk search. In the firefight that followed, Mervete was killed by the policemen while Besnik managed to escape. Mervete's father collected her body the same day. Mervete's funeral took place the next day, at the cemetery in her home village.

(born 10/10/1973, Serb from Pejë/Peć, student, single)

### Svetislav (Ljubomir) Ristić

(born 20/11/1980, Serb from Pejë/Peć, high school student)

### Vukota (Zvonimir) Gvozdrenović

(born 1980, Serb from Pejë/Peć, high school student)

### Dragan (Vojislav) Trifović

(born 10/04/1981, Serb from Pejë/Peć, high school student)

### Zoran (Dragoljub) Stanojević

(born 8/10/1981, Serb from Pejë/Peć, high school student)

### Ivan (Lazar) Obradović

(born 3/01/1984, Serb from Pejë/Peć, high school student)

Ivan studied at the Faculty of Economics in Prishtinë/Priština. Svetislav, Dragan, Vukota, Zoran and Ivan attended the *Sveti Sava (Saint Sava)* High School in **Pejë/Peć**. They all hung out at the *Panda Café* [at 63 Mark Perku Street], the favourite haunt of Serb youth. On **14 December 1998**, at about 20:30h, all six boys were sitting in the *Panda Café*, when two masked men dressed in black opened fire on them

from the door of the café, spraying them with over 60 bullets. Ivan Radević, Ivan Obradović, Dragan and Vukota died on the spot. Zoran and Svetislav, who were seriously injured, were transported to the hospital in Prishtinë/Priština, where they died of their injuries several hours later. The young men were buried in the Christian Orthodox cemetery in Pejë/Peć on 16 December 1998. The funeral service was conducted by the Serbian Orthodox Patriarch Pavle.

### Osmon (Dervish) Berisha

(born 25/05/1974, Albanian from Qeskovë/Českovo, Klinë/Klina municipality, farmer, member of KLA)

Osmon joined the KLA in April 1998. On **14 December 1998**, Osmon was watching the road in the village of **Rashiq/Rašić** with a group of KLA soldiers. When he saw a police car approaching them, Osmon opened fire and the policemen fired back, killing him instantly. The police delivered his body to the Islamic Community of Pejë/Peć, who buried him on 17 December 1998 in the Muslim cemetery in Pejë/Peć. After the war, on 2 October 2000, Osmon's body was transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants located on the hill called *Kodra e kuqe/Crveni breg (Red Hill)* in Grabanicë/Grabanica.
