Besim (Muhamed) Drenica

(born 20/02/1971, Albanian from Borje [Albania])

On **4 June 1998** at about 03:00h, Besim attempted with two other unidentified persons to cross from Albania into Kosovo in the sector of the **Çestak/Čestak** border post. Members of the Yugoslav Army opened fire and Besim was killed in an exchange of fire. Those who were with him managed to escape. After an on-the-spot investigation, members of the Albanian border service took custody of Besim's body.

Hysni (Hajriz) Jetullahu

(born 8/04/1954, Albanian from Domanek, Gllgoc/Glogovac municipality, specialist in education, seven children, member of KLA)

Hysni worked at the railway station in Bajjicë/Banjica village [Gllgoc/Glogovac municipality] until 1990, when he was dismissed. He joined the KLA in April 1998. In early June of 1998, he went to Albania to obtain weapons. On **11 June 1998**, he set off back to Kosovo with some of his comrades in arms. On Mount **Pashtrik/Paštrik** they were ambushed by the Yugoslav Army. Hysni was killed in the exchange of fire. His comrades buried him the same day not far from the place where he fell. After the war, his mortal remains were taken to the cemetery in his native village of Domanek.

Ylber (Zenel) Fanaj

(born 29/08/1979, Albanian from Vërnice/Vrb-

nica, Prizren municipality, unemployed, single, member of KLA)

Albrim (Zaim) Fanaj

(born 28/08/1978, Albanian from Vërnice/Vrbnica, Prizren municipality, unemployed, single, member of KLA)

Ylber and his cousin Albrim were members of the KLA. In late April, they travelled to Albania for training and on **10 July 1998**, Ylber, Albrim and some other KLA members set off back to Kosovo. They were carrying weapons with them. Near **Vërnice/Vrbnica**, they ran into border guards from the nearby border post and a clash occurred. Ylber and Albrim were killed in the conflict. Serb soldiers took their bodies to the morgue of the hospital in Prizren. On 12 July 1998, the families took Ylber and Albrim's bodies and buried them at the cemetery in their native village of **Vërnice/Vrbnica**. At the end of the war [15 September 1999], their bodies were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in the village of Landovicë/Landovica.

Teki (Selami) Ramsha

(born 28/05/1973, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, tyre repairer, one child)

Teki lived with his wife Nashide and their three-year old son Albert and ran a tyre repair service in the town. His job was to collect monetary donations for the KLA from shop owners in the town, and at night he repaired KLA vehicles in his workshop. When Serb forces recovered control of **Rahovec/Orahovac** on **19 July 1998**, the Serb police arrested Teki and his brothers and brought them to the bus station. There he was separated from his brothers and transferred with a group of 20 men to the Police Station in **Prizren**. On 27 July 1998, his brother Xhemajli went to the Police Station to enquire after his brother. They told him that he was there and that „they still had business with him“. Teki was released the following day. He was in a bad
