Selajdin (Halil) Berisha

(born 6/02/1953, Albanian from Lez, Prizren municipality, baker, four children, member of KLA)

Selajdin had been active in the National Movement for Kosovo Liberation since the early 1990s. In the village, he was commander of a sabotage unit. He often led KLA groups into Albania to obtain weapons and equipment. Selajdin was killed by a shell in **Lez** on **1 September 1998**. His body was found in the precincts of the village of Lez on 8 September 1998 by a forestry worker from the village of Kushnin/Kušnin. Selajdin's brother Halim and the forester buried Selajdin in Lez the same day. After the war, on 15 September 1999, Selajdin's family removed his mortal remains to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in the village of Landovicë/Landovica.

Arlind (Avdi) Kryeziu

(born 15/09/1994, Albanian from Prizren)

On 18 July 1998, there were running battles between the Serb police and the KLA in the Prizren suburb of *Tusus*. The Albanians left the neighbourhood and took refuge in **Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo**. The Kryeziu family sheltered with a relative, Liman Kryeziu. The KLA Main Staff HQ was in the village. On **1 September 1998**, an attack by Serb forces began on Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo and the villages to the south of Prizren. Arlind and his family were at Liman's house. At about 12:30h, a shell fired from the Lez direction struck the house, seriously wounding Arlind and his mother Resmije. Arlind was taken to the KLA hospital in the village but very soon succumbed to his wounds. His family buried him that night at the cemetery in Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo.

Qazim (Ibrahim) Poniku

(born 1914, Albanian from Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo, Prizren municipality, 12 children)

Agush (Ahmet) Kryeziu

(born 1925, Albanian from Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo, Prizren municipality, six children)

On **1 September 1998**, when Serb forces began to shell **Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo**, the inhabitants went to shelters near the village which they had prepared in advance. Only a few of the older people remained in the village, among them Agush and Qazim, who was almost completely blind. They were together in Qazim's house. After three days, their sons returned to the village with some of the other inhabitants. They found Qazim's and Agush's bodies by the door of Qazim's house. Both had been killed by a firearm. They were buried the same day at the cemetery in Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo.

Nesim (Esat) Krasniqi

(born 9/06/1930, Albanian from Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo, Prizren municipality, seven children, member of KLA)

Nesim lived with his wife Gjyle, daughter Selima, his daughter-in-law Lumnije and three grandchildren [Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo]. His sons Ahmet, Ajet and Ismet were working abroad, and his four daughters were married. Nesim joined the KLA in early 1998. On the evening of **1 September 1998**, he returned from the position he was manning and took Gjyle, Lumnije and the children to a shelter in the woods [**Lubiqevë/Ljubiçevo**]. He came back for Selime, who had remained with Nesim's brother. That was the last time members of the family saw him alive. On 5 September 1998, some of the villagers found his body in the house of his brother Rrustem. They buried him the same day at the village cemetery. After the war, on 15 September 1999, Nesim's mortal remains were remo-
