

17 July to noon on 19 July 1998, KLA units controlled the entire town except for the Serb neighbourhood.

On the morning of **17 July 1998**, Duško and Đorđe drove to the *Termovent* valve factory in the village of Běrnjak/Brnjača, three kilometres from the town, to get the exhaust pipe on the fire engine repaired. Both worked for the fire brigade. Duško was commander of the fire-fighting department in Rahovec/Orahovac. Đorđe was married to Duško's sister. That day, Đorđe was in his fireman's uniform, Duško in civilian clothing. They had an automatic rifle and a Motorola hand-held radio. In the afternoon, they headed back home. KLA soldiers stopped them on the road to the **Rahovec/Orahovac**. They took them to *Pojilo* [a place where the people from Rahovec/Orahovac brought their cattle to graze and drink], two kilometres from the town in the direction of Malishevě/Mališevo. There Jovan Lukić, who was later also brought there, saw them [see two records below]. The soldiers put caps over their heads and the heads of the other Serbs and Roma who had been kidnapped that day, and took them to the KLA prison in Malishevě/Mališevo [the abandoned new police building]. From there, on 18 July 1998, they drove them in groups to a wood, not far from **Malishevě/Mališevo**. After that, all trace of them was lost. Their mortal remains were found in May 2005 in a mass grave beside the hospital in Malishevě/Mališevo. They were identified by DNA on 7 April 2006. Đorđe was immediately buried in Kraljevo, and Duško in Jagodina.

## Ibrahim (Adem) Cena

(born 3/02/1947, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker, three children)

Ibrahim worked in the (Cultural Centre) in **Rahovec/Orahovac**. He lived in the *Strana* neighbourhood, between the bus station and the *Jaha Petrol* pumps. Ibrahim was divorced, his sons Admir and Mizair worked abroad, and his daughter Mirsada was married. When the shooting began in the town [**17 July 1998**], Ibrahim was in the yard. He was hit by a bullet. A neighbour, Selajdin, took him by tractor to the Health Centre, where he died shortly afterwards. Ibrahim's brother Asllan buried his brother the same night in their field near the place called *Te Rasat/Ploče*. On 5 October 1998, with the permission of the president of the municipality, Anđelko Kolašinac, the family buried Ibrahim at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.

## Srećko (Živojin) Vitošević

(born 16/02/1968, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker)

At 17:15h on **17 July 1998**, Srećko and a relative, Jovan Lukić, set off by car to see Jovan's son, who was doing his military service in Gjakovë/Đakovica. At the exit from **Rahovec/Orahovac**, they were stopped by KLA soldiers. After examining their papers, they took them out of the car, put them in a white van and took them to the *Pojilo*, and then with other abducted Serbs and Roma to the KLA prison in Malishevě/Mališevo. Srećko was locked up in the same room as Jovan. They were subjected to maltreatment the entire night. The torture continued the next day. Srećko Vitošević and Jovan Lukić were taken out of the prison after 20:00h on 18 July 1998, in a group that included Srđan Vitošević, Aleksandar Stanojević and Dušan Patrnođić [see records]. They were put in a van and driven towards Prishtinë/Priština. The
