

[men] stopped at the first woods above **Malishevë/Mališevo**, led them 50 metres away from the asphalt road to a place where pits had been dug, and told them that „your Serbs“ [the first group] had ended up there and that they would too. Jovan somehow managed to save himself (under unexplained circumstances). In May 2005, Srećko's mortal remains were found in a mass grave beside the hospital in Malishevë/Mališevo, of which the family learned on 7 April 2006, following DNA identification. Srećko was buried in Smederevska Palanka.

Tomislav (Trajko) Baljošević

(born 1/10/1937, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, pensioner, one child)

Saša (Tomislav) Baljošević

(born 27/08/1967, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker in the *Termovent*, company, one child)

On the afternoon of Friday [17 July 1998], Tomislav, his wife Krunislava, son Saša and his wife Snežana and their baby were returning from Serbia. At about 20:00h, they arrived in **Rahovec/Orahovac** from the Prizren direction. At the entrance, they were stopped by KLA soldiers, who took them to the KLA prison in **Malishevë/Mališevo**. A survivor, Jovan Lukić, saw father and son on 18 July 1998, when KLA soldiers took them, hands tied, out of the prison with several other Serbs, put them into a van and drove off. In May 2005, their mortal remains were found in a mass grave near the hospital in Malishevë/Mališevo. Following identification, the family laid them to rest at the Lešće cemetery in Belgrade on 7 July 2007.

Čedo (Aleksa) Čabarkapa

(born 8/05/1950, Montenegrin from Rahovec/Orahovac, restaurateur, three children)

Dušan (Božidar) Đinović

(born 1/05/1959, Montenegrin from Rahovec/Orahovac, worked for the EPS)

Čedo and Dušan were good friends. Čedo ran the *Drim* restaurant on the road between Rahovec/Orahovac and Gjakovë/Đakovica. Dušan was an electrician at the transformer station in the nearby village of Xërxë/Zrze. On the evening of Friday 17 July 1998, Dušan and Čedo were sitting in Čedo's restaurant. At about 20:00h, they left for **Rahovec/Orahovac** in Čedo's car. They were stopped by KLA soldiers on the road into town. They took them to the *Pojilo* and then to the KLA prison in **Malishevë/Mališevo**.

Čedo and Dušan were taken out of the prison at about 20:00h on 18 July 1998 in the first group of captured Serbs and Roma. Their mortal remains were found in May 2005 in a mass grave beside the hospital in Malishevë/Mališevo and identified via DNA matching in early April 2006. The family buried Čedo in Pljevlja [Montenegro] on 7 April 2006. Duško was buried in Podgorica [Montenegro] on 19 May 2006.

Azem and his son Visar Isaku worked as smiths-cum-mechanics at the *Orvin* factory in **Rahovec/Orahovac**. Azem had
