

Krsta (Budimir) Stanojević

(born 5/09/1960, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, janitor, two children)

Krsta worked as a janitor in the *Dositelj Obradović* Primary School in **Rahovec/Orahovac**. He and his wife Jasna had twin boys whom they had adopted. When the KLA took over the Health Centre on the evening of 17 July 1998, Jasna was among the nursing staff. On Sunday **19 July 1998**, Krsta came to look for her. The KLA soldiers held him there and later took him to the prison in **Malishevë/Mališevo**. From there, they took him on 26 July 1998 in the direction of Prishtinë/Priština with other imprisoned Serbs from Opterushë/Opteruša and Reti/Retimlje [see records]. Krsta's mortal remains were found in a mass grave in Vulljakë/Volujak in April 2005. Following DNA identification, the family laid him to rest on 12 October 2008 in the churchyard of the Church of the Assumption in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Hasan (Hajrullah) Bugari

(born 9/04/1949, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, cook, three children)

Bekim (Hasan) Bugari

(born 26/01/1971, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker, two children)

Bedri (Sabedin) Bugari

(born 15/04/1971, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, shopkeeper)

Kujtim (Isuf) Isma

(born 5/09/1979, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac)

Kujtim's family was poor. Kujtim's father's uncle had built them a small house in the neighbourhood of *Te Rasat/Ploče* [Rahovec/Orahovac]. Opposite lived Hasan with his family. They had a fine, large ho-

use. Early on the morning of **18 July 1998**, Kujtim's mother and sister left Rahovec/Orahovac and went to Astrazup/Ostrozub. Kujtim and his father Isuf moved into the cellar in Hasan Bugari's house. As well as Hasan, his son Bekim and nephew Bedri were also in the cellar. The other members of the family had fled the town. At about 16:00h, the shooting grew louder, and shells and bullets were falling everywhere. They decided to leave the building. Their plan was to come out on to the main road by the *Haxhi Jaha* petrol station and to hide in the woods. They had gone about 200 metres towards the *Carina* neighbourhood [**Rahovec/Orahovac**], when they were shot at from a house under construction. Bekim, Bedri, Kujtim and Hasan were killed and Isuf was seriously wounded. The bodies of Beki, Bedri, Hasan and Kujtim were taken away on 20 July 1998 by the Serb police and buried in the cemetery in Prizren. After the war, on 17 July 1999, their bodies were exhumed and they were reburied the same day at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Svetozar (Đorđe) Tomić

(born 14/02/1946, Serb from Gjakovë/Đakovica, bank manager, three children)

Svetozar was manager of a branch of the *Jugobanka* in Gjakovë/Đakovica. Early on the morning of **18 July 1998**, Svetozar took his wife to Prizren, from where he went on to **Rahovec/Orahovac**, to look in on their apartment and visit relatives. He disappeared along the way. He was driving a *Ford Escort*, which was found two days later in Rahovec/Orahovac. For a long time the family did not know what had become of him. His mortal remains were found in the Dragodan cemetery in Prishtinë/Priština. The family arranged a funeral on 1 December 2006 at the Orlovača cemetery in Belgrade.
