Abdullah (Zijadin) Bugari

(born 6/06/1962, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker, three children, member of KLA)

Abdullah worked at the *I. maj* depot in **Rahovec/Orahovac**. His father was a porter at the Health Centre. In late 1997, he joined the KLA. During the attack on the town on 17 July 1998, Abdullah's task was to take the Health Centre. Next day [18 July 1998], he set out on an operation to search Serbian apartments and confiscate weapons in a highrise building near the Health Centre. In one of those apartments, Abdullah was killed. His body was found on the street by the police on 19 July 1998, when they had taken control of the town. They buried him at the cemetery in Prizren. After the war, on 17 August 1999, the family and the KLA took his body to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Aleksandar (Gradimir)

Majmarević a.k.a. „Acko“

(born 29/05/1971, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker)

On Friday 17 July 1998, when the KLA entered the town, Serbs in the Serbian neighbourhood organised a defence and mounted a guard over the more important buildings. On Saturday 18 July 1998, Aleksandar was armed and on guard by the reservoir from which the town water supply came [**Rahovec/Orahovac**]. Aleksandar worked for the town's public utilities company. He was killed by a sniper at about 16:00h, outside Siniša Vitošević's house. When darkness had fallen, Siniša Vitošević and Žika Milenković removed his body from the street. The family buried Aleksandar next day in the churchyard of

the Church of the Assumption in Rahovec/Orahovac.
