Tahir (Ramadan) Mushla

(born 23/06/1933, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worked in the *18. novembar* factory, two children)

Tahir was deaf and dumb. He and his wife Zylfije had two children, Naser and Sabrije, who lived abroad. Tahir worked in the *18. novembar* factory in Rahovec/Orahovac and spent most of his free time in the *Teqe* [Dervish lodge]. On 17 July 1998, when the fighting started in **Rahovec/Orahovac**, Zylfije left town with the family, while Tahir remained at home. At a certain point the next day [18 July 1998], Tahir decided to go to the *Teqe*. At a traffic light in the centre of the town, he was killed by a Serb [his name is known to the HLC] who lived in the centre. This was witnessed by some people living in a nearby building. The family learned of Tahir's death at the end of the month, but they could not find his body. It was only some years after the war, on 20 July 2004, that Zylfije and Tahir's brother Ramadan were informed that Tahir's body had been identified, and had previously been exhumed in Hoçë e Madhe/Velika Hoça. The family took custody of Tahir's mortal remains on 27 July 2004, and buried him the same day at the town cemetery.

Baki (Sejdi) Shtavica

(born 18/11/1960, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker, two children)

Baki worked at the *18. novembar* factory in Rahovec/Orahovac. On the morning of 19 July 1998, he went with his family to express their condolences on the death of a relative, Nexhat. At about 09:00h, Serb police units, which had come in as reinforcements from the Prizren direction, clashed with the KLA at the approaches to Rahovec/Orahovac. Baki and the others heard loud firing and turned to run towards Xërxë/Zrze. At the open field known as

Rimnik [**Rahovec/Orahovac**], near a stream, the police opened fire on them. Baki's wife was hit first, then Baki [19 July 1998], by a bullet close to the heart. His family bound up the wound. At about 03:00h in the morning of 20 July 1998, Baki succumbed to his wound. The body remained in the field until 28 July 1998. On that day, the family took it and laid him to rest at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac, where he lies to this day.

Selami (Hysen) Dina

(born 1949, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker, single)

Sokol (Hysen) Dina

(born 29/10/1951, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, teacher at the *Isa Boletini* Primary School, one child)

Ibrahim (Hysen) Dina

(born 1955, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, retired policeman, one child)

Xhemile (Ismail Osa) Dina

(born 1945, Albanian woman from Rahovec/Orahovac, housewife, one child)

Fatmir (Ibrahim) Dina

(born 6/10/1976, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac)

Hysen (Fahredin) Dina

(born 30/06/1978, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, worker)

Special police units from Prizren and Gjakovë/Đakovica arrived in Rahovec/Orahovac late in the afternoon of 18 July 1998. They were wearing green uniforms. Early in the morning of 19 July 1998, they began to enter Albanian houses, conducting searches, looking for weapons, firing at will, lobbing hand grenades into the cellars, looting and burning houses. Members of the Yugoslav Army 549th Motorised Brigade were shelling the town from posi-
