Fadil (Hasan) Haxhimustafa

(born 31/07/1978, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac)

Fadil lived with his mother and sister. His mother took constant care of him because he had mental problems. His father had died before the war. On **19 July 1998**, they went to their relative Qamil Haxhimustafa, who had a house with a cellar [**Rahovec/Orahovac**]. Many people were sheltering there. At one point, Fadil's sister wanted to go to the WC in her own house, and her mother accompanied her there. When they got back, Qamil's house was empty. Everyone had left, and Fadil with them. The mother learned later from the people whom he had left with, that they had brought Fadil back to wait for his mother. From then on, all trace of him was lost. The family knew nothing of what had happened to him until August 2007, when his remains were identified. They then learned that they had been found in the graves beside the rubbish dump [behind the Muslim cemetery]. The family buried Fadil's mortal remains on 20 August 2007 at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Borivoje (Risto) Simić

(born 5/09/1925, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, pensioner, two children)

Jagoš (Arsenije) Fildokić

(born 29/07/1956, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, artisan, three children)

Vekoslav (Stanoje) Kazić

(born 16/09/1966, Serb from Rahovec/Orahovac, three children)

Borivoje, Jagoš and Vekoslav lived in the Serbian neighbourhood, above the Orthodox church. Around noon on Sunday **19 July 1998**, they were at an in-law's on the edge of the Serbian neighbourhood, where the Albanian part of **Rahovec/Orahovac** begins. As they were standing there, a shell went off nearby. All three were killed instantly. They were buried in the grounds of the Church of the Blessed Virgin in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Emsale (Ilaz) Shala

(born 4/07/1967, Albanian woman from Rahovec/Orahovac, administrative officer, member of KLA)

Emsale lived with her parents in the *Krstić* neighbourhood [Rahovec/Orahovac]. Her brothers, Agron and Menderez, lived and worked in Germany. She worked in the administration of the *Silos* company. She joined the KLA in early June 1998 and was put in charge of logistics for the staff HQ which was located in the place called *Carevac* [near the *Pojilo*]. She was the only woman in the unit.

When the KLA started to take the town, Emsale was at a position on *Krstić* hill, armed with her father's pistol. On Sunday **19 July 1998**, she came home to help her parents leave the town. When they got to the *Blato* field, three kilometers from **Rahovec/Orahovac**, a group of Serb police suddenly emerged in front of them, weapons aimed. Emsale drew her father's pistol but was immediately hit by two bullets in the stomach. She lived for another half-hour. With the help of neighbours Ali and Muharrem, her father carried Emsale into Muharrem's yard, where they buried her next day. On 10 December 1998, the
