

air. The people started to run in panic in three directions: towards the *Potok* neighbourhood, towards the *Rainbow* coffee bar and towards the Out-patients' Clinic. Nahit and Bashkim found themselves in front of the police. The police opened fire on them, killing them both instantly. The Serb police buried them beside the rubbish dump [behind the Muslim cemetery] in Rahovec/Orahovac. In May 2007, their remains were exhumed, and in August 2007 identified by DNA. The family buried Bashkim's mortal remains on 20 August 2007 at the Muslim cemetery. Nahit's funeral took place on 15 October 2007, also at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Hanumshahe (Xhemajli)

Eminhazeri

(born 3/10/1949, Albanian woman from Rahovec/Orahovac, housewife, seven children)

Serb police established control over **Rahovec/Orahovac** on the afternoon of 19 July 1998. At about 07:00h on Monday **20 July 1998**, Hanumshahe, her husband and children took shelter in the *Teqe* [Dervish lodge] where other Albanians were also sheltering. At about 10:00h, the Serb police began to drive the people out, so Hanumshahe, her family and other people set off in the direction of Malishevë/Mališevo. There were about 100 people in the column. When they reached the Out-patients' Clinic, someone in the group of Serb police fired, hitting Hanumshahe, who died instantly. Her daughter Elizabeta carried her mother with the help of another woman to the nearest meadow. Later that day, KLA soldiers took her to the *Antin Potok* neighbourhood. Several days later, on 6 August 1998, the family returned from the town and with the permission of the Serbian authorities, buried Hanumshahe at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Ferdeze (Sadik Selan Cena)

Mullaabazi

(born 1931, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, housewife, five children)

Myzaqete (Avdullah Duraku)

Haxhiymeri

(born 1/01/1954, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, housewife, five children)

On the morning of Monday [**20 July 1998**], Ferdeze and her daughter Ibadete went with her son to the *Teqe* [Dervish lodge, Rahovec/Orahovac], to hide from the Serb police. Myzaqete, with her husband Avdullah and children, were also among the many who had taken refuge in the *Teqe*. Ferdeze and Myzaqete were among a group of people who, after leaving the *Teqe*, were in flight through the *Potok* mahala [neighbourhood] towards Malishevë/Mališevo. At the *Srpsko groblje* (*Serbian Cemetery*) [**Rahovec/Orahovac**], the police fired. Myzaqete and Ferdeze were killed instantly, while many were wounded, among them Myzaqete's son Osman. Ferdeze was buried by her daughter Ibadete and Bajram Isma at a place called *Lugštaj*, while Myzaqete was buried by her son Lulzim, near the Rahovec/Orahovac - Malishevë/Mališevo crossroads.

On 20 December 1998, the family brought Myzaqete's mortal remains to the Muslim cemetery. Serb forces exhumed Ferdeze's body on an unspecified date and took it away. On the ICRC list of missing persons, Ferdeze is entered under BLG-804330-01.
