In April 2009, the Kosovo Supreme Court sentenced Selim Krasniqi, Bedri Zyberaj and Agron Krasniqi, members of the KLA military police, to several years in prison each for the unlawful detention and inhumane treatment of Hidaj Popaj and other prisoners in the KLA prison in Drenoc/Drenovac.

Muhedin (Jonuz) Shehu

(born 19/03/1920, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, religious leader)

Hasan (Mustafë) Kafexhiu

(born 19/05/1931, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, watchman and attendant at the *Teqe* [dervish lodge], two children)

Sheikh Muhedin was greatly respected by both Albanians and Serbs in Rahovec/Orahovac. Under communism, he had been convicted because of his political engagement. Hasan had been the guest-master and attendant at the *Teqe* [Dervish Lodge] since 1975. He lived in a house in the *Strana* neighbourhood with his wife Ajshe, and their sons lived in their own houses in the same area.

On the morning of 20 July 1998, the Serb police drove the people out of the *Teqe* [see records]. Sheikh Muhedin and Hasan stayed behind. Samedin and Kadrushe Ejupi found Hasan dead in the yard of the *Teqe* on **21 July 1998** [**Rahovec/Orahovac**]. He had been hit by two bullets to the head and one in the neck. They brought him to Avdyla Shehu's house, and from there the Serb police took him away.

Sheikh Muhedin was killed on **22 July 1998** and buried in the yard of the *Teqe*.

Nine years later, in May 2007, Hasan's family was informed that his mortal remains had been identified, and that they had been found at the rubbish dump [behind the Muslim cemetery] in Rahovec/Ora-

hovac. The family buried Hasan's mortal remains on 12 September 2007 at the Muslim cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.

Musa (Qazim) Kadiri

(born 1937, Albanian from Rahovec/Orahovac, electrician, eight children)

Musa and his wife Hilmije lived in the family home in Miladina Popovića Street, near the bus station on the way out of town [**Rahovec/Orahovac**] in the Xërxë/Zrze village direction. Their sons Mifter, Qazim, Bashkim, Adem and Feim and their families lived with them. Their daughters Sadeta, Myrveta and Drita were married. Their sons left the town with their families on 17 July 1998, and went to Dragobil/Dragobilje [Malishevë/Mališevo municipality]. Next day, they came back for their parents, who, however, decided not to abandon the house. At about 03:00h on **22 July 1998**, Serb police entered Musa's house and ordered him and Hilmije to leave town. Just as they emerged on to the street, about 20 meters from the bus station, another group of police opened fire on them. Musa was hit in the stomach and chest, Hilmije in the leg and arm. A young man brought them in a wheelbarrow to the bus station, from where they were taken by police truck to Prizren, together with the men who had been arrested. Musa and Hilmije were taken to hospital and the men to the Secretariat of the Interior (SUP). Musa was then transferred to the Hospital in Prishtinë/Priština, where he died of his injuries on 29 July 1998. A family friend took his body and buried him at the cemetery in Prishtinë/Priština. After the war, on 30 July 1999, the family removed Musa's body to the cemetery in Rahovec/Orahovac.
