Smajl (Asllan) Jashari

(born 29/09/1951, Albanian from Prekaz i Poshtëm/Donje Prekaze, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, construction worker, five children, member of KLA)

The house of Smajl and his brother Tahir was situated on the main road to **Prekaz i Poshtëm/Donje Prekaze**. Following the events in Likoshan/Likošane and Qirez/Ćirez [see records], Smajl and Tahir took their families to safety in Skënderaj/Srbica and then returned to the village. Smajl stayed at home all the time, whereas Tahir slept each night in the shop they owned, which was located in the vicinity of their home. When a gun battle broke out on the morning of **5 March 1998**, Tahir hid in the attic above the shop and did not come down until 7 March 1998, when the fighting was over. He immediately went to Skënderaj/Srbica to find his family. When he returned home on 10 March 1998, he found blood on a bed and on walls, but Smajl was nowhere to be found. He then went to the Lah Tushila's construction material and equipment warehouse, where he found the body of his brother Smajl, with multiple gunshot wounds. Tahir was told by his cousin Sela that Smajl had been killed after the battle had finished, near the Ammunition factory where Serb police had taken all the survivors. Sela saw a policeman taking Smajl, covered with blood and heavily beaten, behind the Ammunition factory, and heard a burst of gunfire immediately afterwards.

Andreas (Gojko) Končarević

(born 11/01/1973, Serb from Novi Sad, member of MUP RS)

Rade (Bogdan) Radaković

(born 14/08/1961, Serb from Novi Sad, two children, member of MUP RS)

Andreas and Rade worked and lived with their families in Novi Sad. Before finishing a police training course, Andreas and Rade had completed vocational school for textiles and high school of mechanical engineering respectively. Andreas joined the Serbian State Security Service, while Rade became a member of the Special Anti-terrorist Unit. Both men died on **5 March 1998** in the battle in the *Jashari* neighbourhood of **Prekaz i Poshtëm/Donje Prekaze**. Andreas and Rade were buried on 7 March 1998 in the Novi Sad City Cemetery.

Riza (Osman) Thaçi

(born 1931, Albanian from Burojë/Bročna, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, farmer, nine children)

Riza was badly wounded on **5 March 1998**, the day on which Serb forces entered **Burojë/Bročna**. While other village residents fled into a wood, Riza stayed in the village with the women and children of the Thaçi and Hajdini families, hiding in the basement of their cousin Ramadan Thaçi. Riza came out of the basement at one point to see whether Serb forces were still in the village, and was spotted by Serb soldiers who opened fire on him, hitting him in the back, neck and leg. His family transported him the next morning to the hospital in Pejë/Peć. Several days later, he was discharged from hospital, in a bad condition. He died on 22 March 1998 and was buried the following day in the village cemetery.
