

On **28 March 1998**, Mujë and his wife Vasa were alone at home. The other family members had fled the village. Vasa was in the house when she heard noise and gunshots. She went to the door and saw Mujë lying on the ground in the yard [**Vojnîkë/Voçnjak**]. She walked over to him and saw that he had several wounds on his body. He passed away just before dawn. Their son Lutfi arrived in the morning with his friends, and they buried Mujë in the village cemetery.

(born 5/03/1947, Albanian from Zabërgjë/Zabrde, Klinë/Klina municipality, haulier, seven children)

Salih (Jashar) Berisha

(born 19/12/1948, Albanian from Zabërgjë/Zabrde, Klinë/Klina municipality, owner of the *Naseri* petrol station, two children)

Brahim (Selim) Salihaj

(born 8/06/1950, Albanian from Zabërgjë/Zabrde, Klinë/Klina municipality, construction worker, four children)

Brahim (Halil) Zogaj

(born 12/12/1940, Albanian from Gllarevë/Iglarevo, Klinë/Klina municipality, forester, nine children)

Ramadan (Brahim) Zogaj

(born 24/03/1958, Albanian from Gllarevë/Iglarevo, Klinë/Klina municipality, auto mechanic, six children)

Fadil (Brahim) Zogaj

(born 4/04/1971, Albanian from Gllarevë/Iglarevo, Klinë/Klina municipality, auto mechanic, single)

Bajram Berisha lived with his wife and their seven children in Zabërgjë/Zabrde [Klinë/Klina municipality]. In March 1998, Bajram's brother Salih and his family, having fled Gllarevë/Iglarevo [Klinë/Klina municipality], came to stay at Bajram's.

Salih owned a petrol station in Gllarevë/Iglarevo, near the Prishtinë/Priştina - Pejë/Peç road. At about 22:00h on 2 April 1998, a group of armed Albanian-speaking men,

wearing uniforms and balaclavas, came to Bajram's house. They put Salih, his son Naser, Bajram and his sons Xhemë and Bislim into a *Volkswagen* van and drove them to the KLA headquarters in Likoc/Likovac. Inside the headquarters, the men were beaten up and then again put in the van and taken to the village of Murgë/Murga [Skënderaj/Srbica municipality]. Xhemë, Bislim and Naser were released in Murgë/Murga. Bajram and Salih have never been seen again.

That same evening, a group of men wearing masks took Brahim Salihaj from his home in Gllarevë/Iglarevo, where he lived with his wife Nazile and their four children, put him into a *Volkswagen* van and drove off towards Likoc/Likovac.

Brahim Zogaj and his three sons, Ramadan, Fadil and Tefik, were also taken that evening from their home in Gllarevë/Iglarevo by some masked men. Tefik was released later, but Brahim, Ramadan and Fadil were made to walk to the cemetery in Zabërgjë/Zabrde, where they were put in the *Volkswagen* van and driven away to an unknown location.

The brothers Bajram and Salih Berisha, Brahim Salihaj, Brahim Zogaj and his sons Ramadan and Fadil were last seen sometime after midnight on **3 April 1998** in the KLA headquarters in **Likoc/Likovac**.

The bodies of the brothers Bajram and Salih Berisha, Brahim Salihaj, Brahim Zogaj and his sons Ramadan and Fadil were subsequently found at the place known as *Te Rasat/Ploçe* near Rahovec/Orahovac. The men had been killed by firearms. Their bodies bore signs of violence, such as haematomas and fractures. Their respective families recovered their bodies on 7 April 1998 and buried them: Bajram and Salih Berisha and Brahim Salihaj were buried in the cemetery in Zabërgjë/Zabrde; Brahim Zogaj and his sons Ramadan and Fadil were buried the same day in the cemetery in Gllarevë/Iglarevo.
