

them uninterruptedly. Rifat was seriously wounded in the back just before he reached the wood. Muhamet, after hiding his wife and children in the wood, went back with his brother to rescue Rifat. Just as he was bending down to lift his uncle up from the ground, Muhamet was shot dead with a bullet to the neck. Rifat succumbed to his wound shortly afterwards. The Çitakus buried Rifat and Muhamet the next day in the village cemetery in Çitak/Çitak.

### Ajmane (Sejdi Babaj) Çitaku

(born 1924, Albanian woman from Çitak/Çitak, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, housewife, seven children)

When Serb forces re-entered Çitak/Çitak on the morning of **18 May 1998**, the aged Ajmane hid in her cousin Jetish's basement together with other women and children of her family. Terrible shooting and shelling could be heard throughout the next several hours. At about 13:00h, Ajmane managed to leave the house to fetch some water for the children. She never came back. Four hours later the shooting ceased, and the people hiding in the basement came out and found Ajmane dead in the yard. She had been shot twice in the chest. Ajmane was buried by her family the next day in the village cemetery.

### Dostana (Bogić) Šmigić

(born 3/06/1957, Serb woman from Skënderaj/Srbica, administrative clerk, single)

Dostana worked at the Employment Agency in Skënderaj/Srbica. On **18 May 1998**, she left in her car for Leçinë/Leočina to attend the end of the forty-day mourning period for her late grandmother. Driving through **Klinë e Epërme/Gornja Klina** she came across a friend, Vlada Kostić, who was

waiting for a bus. She offered him a lift but he refused, saying that it was safer to travel on a bus. Vlada was the last person to see Dostana. She is registered on the ICRC list of missing persons under BLG-803509-01.

### Ramadan (Abaz) Loshi

(born 8/08/1927, Albanian from Runik/Rudnik, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, brick layer, eight children)

Ramadan lived with his wife Hatmane and daughters Lutfiye and Shehrije in Runik/Rudnik. On **18 May 1998**, three days after Serb forces had attacked the nearby village of Padalishtë/Padalište, Ramadan took the regular bus running from Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica to Pejë/Peć to visit his brothers and cousins who lived in Padalishtë/Padalište, unaware that the cousins had already left their village. The next day, his family learned that Ramadan had been killed. A cousin of his found his body in her yard [**Padalishtë/Padalište**] on 18 May 2011, when she returned to the village to let the cattle out. The Loshis buried Ramadan in the cemetery in Padalishtë/Padalište.

### Dejan (Obard) Stoiljković

(born 20/02/1973, Serb from Ropotovë e Madhe/Veliko Ropotovo, Kamenicë/Kosovska Kamenica municipality, single, member of MUP RS)

Dejan finished secondary police school and joined the Gjilan/Gnjilane police department in 1992. On **19 May 1998**, Dejan and his uncle boarded a bus from Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica to Pejë/Peć. After seeing his brother in Pejë/Peć, he
