Miradije (Bislim) Tahiri

(born 8/05/1956, Albanian woman from Radishevë/Radiševo, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, housewife, four children)

When fighting between the KLA and Serb forces broke out in Radishevë/Radiševo on **25 July 1998**, Miradije's family fled into a wood, whilst Miradije remained at home. Three days later [28 July 1998] and after Serb forces had withdrawn from the village, Miradije's family returned but did not find Miradije in the house. They found her body near the village fountain [**Radishevë/Radiševo**]. Miradije had been shot in the head. That same night, the Tahiris buried Miradije near the fountain. After the war, on 15 October 1999, her remains were transferred to the village Cemetery for War Victims.

Ramadan (Halim) Tahiri

(born 1/05/1958, Albanian from Radishevë/Radiševo, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, worker, seven children, member of KLA)

Ramadan worked at the local farmers' co-op. When Serb forces entered **Radishevë/Radiševo** on the morning of **25 July 1998**, Ramadan left his family and headed with a group of men towards the nearby village of Kotorr/Kotore. He was last seen by his cousins Mursel, Hajriz and Sokol. The men

of the village later on searched for him, without success. His family has had no information on his fate to date. His disappearance has not been reported to the ICRC.

Sabit (Sadri) Ahmeti

(born 5/01/1972, Albanian from Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica, student, single, member of KLA)

Beqir (Muje) Hajrizi

(born 10/05/1938, Albanian from Kotorr/Kotor, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, farmer, eleven children, member of KLA)

Azem (Beqir) Hajrizi

(born 10/04/1966, Albanian from Radishevë/Radiševo, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, farmer, three children, member of KLA)

Faik (Beqir) Hajrizi

(born 13/10/1970, Albanian from Kotore/Kotorr, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, technology professor, single, member of KLA)

Sabit was born in Radishevë/Radiševo and lived in Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica. He had fought in the war in Croatia. He joined the KLA immediately after its foundation. Faik joined the KLA in March 1998, and his father Beqir and brothers Azem and Petrit did so on 15 April 1998. When Serb forces on **25 July 1998** attacked Radishevë/Radiševo, Sabit took his family to nearby Kotorr/Kotore. There he met with Beqir, Azem, Faik and two other village residents, who were KLA members, and they all headed back for Radishevë/Radiševo. Near the place known as *Te ara ë Syles/Sylina njiva* (*Syla's Field*) [**Radishevë/Radiševo**] they encountered Serb forces. Faik and Beqir were killed, whereas Sabit's and Azem's fates remained unknown until 4 August 1998, when some KLA soldiers found their bodies a short distance from the spot where Faik and Beqir were killed. All four men were buried the same day in *Te ara ë Syles/Sylina njiva*. After the war, on 12 No-
