

ce brought Muhamet there. They asked him where the other men were and he said he did not know. They immediately put him in the van and drove off towards **Krasaliq/Krasalić**. Before long, Hamide heard volleys of fire. The next day, Aziz Hajrizi from Krasaliq/Krasalić informed the Idrizis that he had found Muhamet's body in a field in his village. The Idrizis buried Muhamet the next day in the cemetery in Beçiq/Bečić. In late August 2000, international forensics exhumed his body and positively identified it. The Idrizis reinterred Muhamet on 6 October 2000 in the cemetery in Beçiq/Bečić.

Rrustem (Fetah) Karagja

(born 1948, Albanian from Çikatovë e Vjetër/Staro Čikatovo, Gillogoc/Glogovac municipality, farmer, four children)

Rrustem left Çikatovë e Vjetër/Staro Čikatovo with his family in late May 1998. Serb police were quartered in the *Feronikl* factory in Gillogoc/Glogovac at the time. The large-scale offensive by Serb forces on **22 September 1998** found them hiding in the wood above the village of Gradicë/Gradica [Mount *Çiçavicë/Čičavica*]. In the havoc that followed, Rrustem split from the rest of his family and headed for Krasmiroc/Krasmirovac. Three days later, Ferki Karagja, a cousin of Rrustem and a KLA soldier, found Rrustem's body in a pool inside the forest near **Krasmiroc/Krasmirovac**. His body bore visible gunshot wounds. Assisted by other KLA soldiers, Ferki buried Rrustem in the vicinity. After the war, on 7 November 1999, Rrustem's body was transferred to the cemetery in Çikatovë e Vjetër/Staro Čikatovo.

Murat (Muharrem) Haliti

(born 3/05/1964, Albanian from Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica, teacher, two children, member of KLA)

Fatmir (Hajrush) Ahmeti

(born 14/09/1975, Albanian from Lubavec/Ljubovac, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, technician, single, member of KLA)

Murat, history teacher at the *Frank Bardhi* School in Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica, was commander of the local KLA headquarters based in his native village of Lubavec/Ljubovac. Fatmir was a member of the same unit. On **22 September 1998** Serb forces surrounded Lubavec/Ljubovac and started shelling it at about 08:00h, from the hill above the village. Village residents started fleeing on their tractors. Murat's and Fatmir's unit was holding the position near *Te Ceshmja e Vojteshit/Vojteska çesma (Vojteshi's Font)*. At around 13:00h, Murat and Fatmir headed for Prekaz i Epërm/Gornje Prekaze to help their KLA fellow combatants, and did not return to Lubavec/Ljubovac that night. Two days later, Murat's parents found the bodies of Murat and Fatmir in a wood between **Lubavec/Ljubovac** and Prekaz i Epërm/Gornje Prekaze. Their funeral took place on 24 September 1998 at the village cemetery.

Hajrush (Qamil) Ahmeti

(born 9/12/1939, Albanian from Lubavec/Ljubovac, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, construction worker, five children)

Hajrush worked for the *Budučnost* roof tile factory in Skënderaj/Srbica. On **22 September 1998**, Hajrush took his family to a wood on Mount *Çiçavicë/Čičavica*, in flight from the Serb attack on their village. Hajrush himself then took refuge deeper into the wood with his brother Raif and some relatives of theirs, saying to his family that he would come back in the evening to see them. Later that day, Hajrush left Raif and the others, saying he wanted to find his son Fatmir, a KLA member, and bring him some food [see record above]. For three days,
