Zyhrije (Ajet Ahmeti) Ngucati

(born 3/05/1958, Albanian woman from Marinë/Marina, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, housewife, six children)

Zyhrije lived in the village of Marinë/Marina with her husband Sami and their children. When Serb forces launched their offensive in the *Drenica* region on **22 September 1998**, they entered Marinë/Marina as well. On hearing the first shots being fired in the village, Zyhrije took the children and left the house en route to the neighbouring village of Rezallë/Rezala, together with other village residents. They walked across fields in a column, pursued by shooting and shelling. As they reached a wood [**Marinë/Marina**], a shell went off near Zyhrije, discharging shrapnel into his back and killing her instantly. Her fellow villagers took her children to Rezallë/Rezala, leaving Zyhrije's body at the spot where she was killed. Her husband Sami buried her in the cemetery in Marinë/Marina.

Halim (Xhemajl) Avdiu

(born 12/05/1939, Albanian from Mikushnicë/Mikušnica, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, farmer, two children)

Halim was a farmer. He lived with his wife Zahide, son Izet, daughter-in-law Hana and four grandchildren. Early in the morning on **22 September 1998**, Serb forces shelled Mikushnicë/Mikušnica. Halim sent his family to Mount *Çiçavicë/Çiçavica* with other village residents, while he stayed behind to look after the cattle in the village

[**Mikushnicë/Mikušnica**]. That was the last time his family saw him. Izet returned to the village the following day to see his father. The village was burned down and Halim was nowhere to be found. Izet heard about the mortal remains found in Hamdi Bedriu's house. No one knew to whom they belonged to until Halim's ne-*phew* recognised the peasant shoes he had given to Halim as a gift several days before. Izet collected the mortal remains in a bag and hid them in his basement. Three days later [26 September 1998], the Avdiu buried Halim's mortal remains in the village cemetery.

Abedin (Avdulla) Vojvoda

(born 5/02/1952, Albanian from Llaushë/Lauša, Skendëraj/Srbica municipality, construction worker, five children, member of KLA)

Abedin lived with his wife Adile and their five children in the *Vojvoda* neighbourhood of Llaushë/Lauša. He joined the KLA in June 1998. When Serb forces in August 1998 stationed themselves in this village, Abedin sent his family to Qirez/Ćirez, while he stayed behind with the KLA. On 22 September 1998, Abedin went to Qirez/Ćirez to see his family. On that same day, Serb forces attacked Qirez/Ćirez and the outlying villages. The next day [**23 September 1998**], Abedin, in the company of several other men, tried to fight their way to the nearby village of Kolle/Kolo [Vush-trri/Vučitrn municipality]. He was killed fighting Serb forces in a wood on Mount *Çiçavicë/Çiçavica* above **Qirez/Ćirez**. KLA soldiers buried him in the wood later that day. On 5 November 1998, Abedin's body was transferred to the cemetery in Rezallë e Re/Ljudevik.

Behram (Hazir) Morina

(born 1/05/1959, Albanian from Gllobar/Glo-bar, Gillogoc/Glogovac municipality, construction worker, member of KLA)
