In the evening, Idriz's brother Hajriz carried Idriz's body to the place called *Mali e Zabelit/Planinski Gaj (Zabel's Copse)*. Two days later, the Salihis buried Idriz in the village cemetery, where he rests today.

### **Smajl (Bajram) Millaku**

(born 18/05/1929, Albanian from Siqevë/Sićevo, Klinë/Klina municipality, farmer, four children)

### **Sefer (Smajl) Millaku**

(born 3/01/1948, Albanian from Siqevë/Sićevo, Klinë/Klina municipality, farmer, five children)

The family of Smajl Millaku had fourteen members. His son Sefer had worked for the police until the 1990's; after that, he switched to farming. During the Serb shelling from the direction of Dobëdol/Dobri Do in early August 1998, all Smajl's family members fled to the village of Caravik/Cerovik [Klinë/Klina municipality]. On the morning of **25 September 1998**, Smajl left for Siqevë/Sićevo. His younger son Zeqir had left an hour before to check on their house. Smajl was shot dead as he walked along the train tracks between two tunnels in the village of **Aqarevë/Ovçarevo**. His body remained in a bush alongside the tracks. The following day [**26 September 1998**], Sefer was informed by Ramiz Jashari from Aqarevë/Ovçarevo that his father had been killed, and went with him to Aqarevë/Ovçarevo. Some 100 metres from the spot where Smajl's body was lying, Serb snipers shot at Sefer and Ramiz. Sefer was hit in the heart and died instantly. Ramiz escaped. That evening, Zeqir came across Sefer's body by accident. Zeqir, Sefer's son Behar and several other cousins buried Sefer that same night in *Mulliri i Gege/Gegina Vodenica (Gege's Mill)* in Siqevë/Sićevo. The next morning, Zeqir, assisted by young man who had discovered Smajl's body, buried his father alongside Sefer. On 22 November 1998, their bodies were tran-

sferred to the cemetery in Siqevë/Sićevo.

### **Hanife (Ramadan Asllani)**

#### **Jashari**

(born 2/02/1953, Albanian woman from Aqarevë/Ovçarevo, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, housewife, eight children)

On **25 September 1998**, Hanife was in her home with her son and daughter [Aqarevë/Ovçarevo]. At about 11:00h, shooting rang out, after which members of Serb forces entered the village. Hanife told her children to go immediately with other neighbours to the nearby creek and that she would join them later on, as soon as she had packed some food and clothes. Her children waited for her to join them, but Hanife never arrived. Three days later, after Serb forces had withdrawn from the village, a village resident found Hanife's body in a wood on Mount *Škoza/Mali i Shkozës [Aqarevë/Ovçarevo]*. Her family buried her the same day in the village cemetery. After the war, on 2 September 1999, Hanife's body was transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants and War Victims in Aqarevë/Ovçarevo.

### **Driton (Nasuf) Hysenaj**

(born 3/06/1981, Albanian from Obri e Epërme/Gornje Obrinje, Gllugoc/Glogovac municipality, secondary school student)

Driton lived in the *Hysenaj* neighbourhood of Obri e Epërme/Gornje Obrinje. When clashes between the KLA and Serb forces broke out in that village on 25 September 1998, Driton and his family and fellow villagers - mostly women, children and the elderly, as well as some twenty adults and young men - took to the woods above the village of Tërdec/Trdevac. Two days later, [**27 September 1998**] Serb forces discovered them. They separated Driton and the other men from the group, frisked them,
