

and took refuge in the village of Hoçë e Madhe/Velika Hoça [Rahovec/Orahovac municipality]. On **22 September 1998** Boban and his brother's wife and children went to **Reqan/Reçane** to visit Boban's sister Zorica. Boban did not stay long at Zorica's. He left his sister-in-law and the children there and left around 13:30h with Zorica's son Srećko for Mohlan/Movljane, to visit some relatives there. He said he would be back soon. That was the last time Srećko and Boban were seen alive. In October of the same year, Boban's car, a *Lada Riva*, was found alongside the road in the village of Budakovë/Budakovo. Boban and Srećko were registered on the ICRC list of missing persons under YUK-050047-01 and YUK-050047-02 respectively.

Selman (Ajet) Kadrijaj

(born 4/05/1910, Albanian from Krushicë e Epërme/Gornja Krušica, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, farmer, five children)

Selman's family fled Krushicë e Epërme/Gornja Krušica on **27 September 1998**, as soon as they saw Serb forces approaching the village. Being aged, sick and immobile, Selman stayed at home [**Krushicë e Epërme/Gornja Krušica**]. Two days later, after the Serb forces had withdrawn from the village, Selman's son Selim and a cousin of his returned home, and found Selman's body with a chest wound. They buried him the next day in a field above the village. After the war, in March 2001, Selman's mortal remains were transferred to the village cemetery.

Zenel (Idriz) Morina

(born 28/10/1966, Albanian from Staravučinë/Stara Vučina, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, worker, two children, member of KLA)

Until 1998, Zenel had worked in Austria, while his family lived in Staravučinë/Stara Vučina. When he heard of the events in Prekaz i Poshtëm/Donje Prekaze [see records], he returned to Kosovo and joined the KLA in the village of Reshtan/Raštane. He was later transferred to the KLA local headquarters in Budakovë/Budakovo. He went to Albania for weapons on three occasions. On the morning of **27 September 1998**, Zenel and ten other soldiers arrived in **Staravučinë/Stara Vučina**, where they expected a Serb attack to take place. After telling the local residents to leave the village, they took up their positions. The Serb attack started at about 09:00h. Zenel received one bullet, which killed him immediately. He was buried the next day by his comrades and neighbours in his field in Staravučinë/Stara Vučina. After the war, on 18 September 1999, Zenel's mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Suharekë/Suva Reka.

Arif (Maliq) Ndrecaj

(born 1909, Albanian from Maqitevë/Maçitevo, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, farmer, seven children)

Xhyzide (Sylejman Mustafaj) Ndrecaj

(born 1909, Albanian woman from Maqitevë/Maçitevo, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, housewife, seven children)

The elderly Arif and Xhyzide lived alone in their house in Maqitevë/Maçitevo. Arif was disabled. The shelling of the village that started on the morning **27 September 1998** found Arif and Xhyzide at home. Their son-in-law Muhamet, who lived in nearby
