

Slapuzane, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, tradesman, married, member of KLA)

Milaim (Bajram) Bugari

(born 24/11/1969, Albanian from Peqan/Pećane, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, construction worker, three children, member of KLA)

From 1997, Hafir was engaged in transporting and looking after weapons for the KLA. From February 1998, he took part in organising watch guards and digging trenches and bunkers in his village. He was also responsible for controlling two KLA positions - *Te Drita* and *Qukarke*. On 25 September 1998 he was transferred to **Vraniq/Vranić** as reinforcement. Milaim Bugari was also sent to Vraniq/Vranić to strengthen the defence of that village. Hafir and Milaim were killed at about 17:00h on **28 September 1998** fighting Serb forces near *Maja e Ahishtes/Bukvin Vrh* (*Beech Tree Peak*). The next day [29 September 1998], Hafir's brother and several KLA soldiers carried their bodies into the village mosque in Vraniq/Vranić. Hafir and Milaim were buried on 1 October 1998 in the village cemetery. After the war, on 18 September 1998, their mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Suharekë/Suva Reka.

Željko (Stamenija) Jovičić

(born 25/12/1966, Serb from Sopot, single, member of MUP RS)

Nebojša (Radivoj) Jevtić

(born 9/09/1968, Serb from Šabac, two children, member of MUP RS)

Saša (Zoran) Simeunović

(born 15/08/1969, Serb from Dučina, Sopot municipality, two children, member of MUP RS)

After completing police secondary school,

Željko joined the Sopot Police Department [Serbia]. During 1998 he was often sent to Kosovo on field assignments. Nebojša, a police officer serving with the Obrenovac Police Department, lived with his wife and their two children in Šabac [Serbia]. Saša lived with his parents, wife and their two children in Dučina, near Sopot. He worked for the Voždovac Municipal Police Department [Belgrade] from 1988.

On the afternoon of **28 September 1998**, Željko, Nebojša and Saša were riding in a convoy of combat vehicles. The convoy stopped near **Budakovë/Budakovo**. After a short break, the three men were assigned to a group of policemen who were to examine a slope alongside the road. As the policemen walked up towards the top of the slope, they encountered some KLA members who opened fire on them, killing Željko and Saša. Nebojša was seriously injured and died en route to the Prizren hospital. All three men were buried on 30 September 1998 - Saša in the cemetery in Dučina, Željko in the cemetery in Sopot and Nebojša in the cemetery in his native Matijevac.

Mursel (Hajrullah) Buqa

(born 23/04/1937, Albanian from Budakovë/Budakovo, Suharekë/Suva Reka municipality, farmer, eight children)

Mursel and his family left their home in Budakovë/Budakovo on 26 September 1998. The women and children went to Mushtishte/Mušutište, whereas Mursel and his son Salih hid themselves in *Livadhët e Lakes/Ljakine livadë* (*Laka's Meadows*), near **Budakovë/Budakovo**. The next day [27 September 1998] they returned to their village to check on their houses. Mursel was captured by Serb forces as he approached his house. Salih, who was hiding near the house, heard
