

Rexhep (Bajram) Musa

(born 20/11/1962, Albanian from Ceceli/Cecelija, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, taxi driver, five children, member of KLA)

Rexhep joined the KLA on 4 August 1998. He was staying with his group in the village of Samadrexhë/Samodreža. On **30 August 1998**, he was wounded in **Samadrexhë/Samodreža**, at a place known as *Gradina*, on the border with Ceceli/Cecelija and Studime e Epërme/Gornja Sudimlja. He died on the way to the KLA Hospital in the village of Bajgorë/Bajgora [Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality]. He was buried the following day, 31 August 1998, in the family cemetery in the village of Ceceli/Cecelija. After the war, on 1 September 1998, his body was taken to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in the village of Stanoc i Epërm/Gornje Stanovce.

Amrush (Muharem) Asllani

(born 26/12/1947, Albanian from Stanoc i Poshtëm/Donje Stanovce, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, worker, six children)

Amrush worked at the *Obilic* Thermoelectric Plant. He lived with his wife Zyle and their children in **Stanoc i Poshtëm/Donje Stanovce**. His brothers Agush and Deli lived in houses next to him. In early September 1998, Serb forces fired at Amrush's yard and set fire to the hay. At work, he was threatened by a Serbian man who accused him of helping the KLA. At about 22:00h on the evening of **13 September 1998**, Amrush and Zyle were alone in the house, when they heard the dog starting to bark outside. After some time, Amrush decided to go out and see why the dog was barking. Immediately afterwards, Zyle heard a burst of fire. She went out and began looking around the yard for Amrush, but did not find him. Next morning, Agush found his brother's body on the road in front of the gate. He had been shot in the head. His family laid him to rest the same day at the village cemetery.

Abedin (Sheqir) Ferizi

(born 20/09/1943, Albanian from Pasomë/Pasoma, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, teacher, four children, member of KLA)

Abedin was headmaster of the Primary School in the village of Rashan/Raşane [Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality] and president of the Democratic League of Kosovo in his own village. Because of his political activities, the police searched his house several times. In mid-1998 he joined the KLA.

At about 09:00h on 15 September 1998, Abedin and the other members of his household saw that Serb forces were approaching the village. The villagers immediately began to leave their homes. Some of the Ferizi family went to Vushtrri/Vučitrn, but Abedin remained with his wife Hatemja and his son Veton, who was also a member of the KLA. Two days later, on **17 September 1998**, Serb forces began to shell the village, so Hatemja also left. Abedin and Veton went to join the soldiers in the woods. That day, Abedin was helping civilians to leave the village [**Pasomë/Pasoma**]. At one point, just as he was helping a young man, he was struck by a sniper's bullet. The young man went to the nearby village of Kçiqi i Madh/Veliki Kičić [Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality] and related what had happened. Abedin's nephew Shefki and a local man went to fetch Abedin. They brought him to the house of Sabit Pllana in Kçiqi i Madh/Veliki Kičić, and two days later he was taken to the KLA infirmary in Gradicë/Gradica [Glllogoc/Glogovac municipality], where he succumbed to his injuries on 20 September 1998. He was buried on 21 September 1998 at the cemetery in Pasomë/Pasoma.
