Miloš (Nikodin) Bradić

(born 12/01/1963, Serb from Belgrade, one child, member of MUP RS)

Miloš worked at the Voždovac Police Department, Belgrade.

From March 1998, he was stationed in Kosovo, returning to visit his family from time to time. The last time they saw him was on 17 September 1998. He was killed by a hand grenade activated by one of the inhabitants of the village of **Ošljane/Oshlan** [see record above] on **22 September 1998**. His family buried Miloš on 25 September 1998 at the Central Cemetery in Belgrade.

Bislim (Kamber) Imeri

(born 1/04/1975, Albanian from Oshlan/Ošljane, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, single, unemployed, member of KLA)

Bislim took part in the defence of **Oshlan/Ošljane** on **22 September 1998**, when Serb forces mounted an attack on the KLA in the Mount **Çiçavicë/Čičavica** zone. On that day, Bislim was hit by a sniper in the village wood [Oshlan/Ošljane]. He was found by his father, Kamber, and a relative, Rasim. They buried him four days later, when the Serb forces had left. After the war, in June 1999, Bislim's body was taken to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Shipol/Šipolje [Mitrovicë/Kosovska Mitrovica municipality].

Mustafë (Shaqir) Shyti

(born 10/10/1945, Albanian from Oshlan/Ošljane, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, teacher, six children, member of KLA)

Sheremet (Bajrush) Sheremeti

(born 20/03/1961, Albanian from Oshlan/Ošljane, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, electrical engineer, two children)

Mustafë was arrested several times because of his political activity, the first time in 1967 and the last in April 1998. He was an activist of the National Movement for Kosovo Liberation and Albanian Language and Literature graduate who wrote and published poetry. He had four daughters and two sons. Sheremet worked for the *Lamkos* company in Vushtrri/Vučitrn, and lived with his wife Lumnija, their children and the family of his brother Nezir. Sheremet and Nezir's father, Bajrush, also lived with them.

On 21 September 1998, Bajrush, Sheremet and Nezir took their wives and children out of Oshlan/Ošljane, leaving Sheremet's other brother, Tahir, and nephews Sokol and Driton, with Bajrush and Sheremet in the house, while Nezir went to join the KLA. On **22 September 1998**, when Serb forces entered the village [**Oshlan/Ošljane**], Sheremet and the others fled into the woods to a place known as *Kroi i Sokolave/Potok sokolova* (*Falcon's Stream*). There they found Mustafë, Nezir and other KLA soldiers. They were discovered by Serb police, who opened fire on them. Mustafë and the other soldiers returned fire, while Sheremet and the other unarmed men fled. Mustafë was seriously wounded in the exchange of fire. He succumbed to his injuries two days later in the house of his relative Hasan Shyti.

Shortly afterwards, the same day, the police found Sheremet in the place where he was hiding and attempted to overpower him. When Sheremet snatched a rifle from
