

The elderly Azize and her family fled to Zhilivodë/Žilivoda on 20 September 1998. When shells began falling there too on **23 September 1998**, Azize fled to the woods above the village [Zhilivodë/Žilivoda] with her family and the other inhabitants [Mount *Çiçavicë/Čičavica*]. They stopped at a place known as *Varri i Hoxhës/Hodžin grob (Hoxha's Grave)*, where there were other villagers from Zhilivodë/Žilivoda and the surrounding villages. At about 12:00h, Serb forces shelled the woods. A shell exploded close to Azize, wounding her severely in the chest and leg. She died immediately. The family was forced to flee further. Azize's body remained in the woods until 27 September 1998, when her sons Xhevat, Ali and Syle took their mother's body and buried it at the cemetery in Gradicë/Gradica [Glllogoc/Glogovac municipality]. After the war, on 27 September 1999, the family transferred Azize's mortal remains to the cemetery in Hamidi/Hamidija.

Fikrije (Bejtë) Klinaku

(born 8/01/1998, Albanian baby girl from Bivolak/Bivoljak, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality)

Fikrije's parents took this infant and her sisters Arlinda and Durajete out of the village of Bivolak/Bivoljak on 22 September 1998. They left on a tractor with the other inhabitants for neighbouring Zhilivodë/Žilivoda, and overnighted at a place known as *Çezma e Gomarit/Česma Gomura (Gomur Fountain)* above Zhilivodë/Žilivoda [Mount *Çiçavicë/Čičavica*]. Shelling began on the morning of **23 September 1998**. People began to run and in the ensuing confusion, Fikrije's father Bejtë became separated from his family. A shell fell near the Klinaku family's tractor, severely wounding the baby. Members of the Serb forces took her, her mother and sisters and two wounded relatives with them. When they got to Obiliq/Obilić, her mother took the little girls to the house of a friend, while the soldiers took the wounded to the hospital in

Prishtinë/Priština, where Fikrije died soon afterwards. Hearing what had happened, Bejtë went to the hospital the same day to identify his daughter. He carried the dead child home in his arms to Bivolak/Bivoljak, where she was buried the same day. International forensic experts exhumed her body on 24 August 2000 and conducted an autopsy at the Institute of Forensic Medicine in Rahovec/Orahovac. On 26 September 2000, the family again laid little Fikrije to rest at the same spot.

Adriana (Nexhmedin) Klinaku

(born 27/03/1998, Albanian baby girl from Bivolak/Bivoljak, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality)

With his wife, his son Fisnik (eighteen months) and his daughter Adriana (six months), Nexhmedin and his parents joined the villagers who were leaving Bivolak/Bivoljak early in the morning of 22 September 1998. They went to neighbouring Zhilivodë/Žilivoda, spending the night sleeping on their tractors at a place called *Çezma e Gomarit/Česma Gomura (Gomur Fountain)* above the village Zhilivodë/Žilivoda [Mount *Çiçavicë/Čičavica*]. Next morning, **23 September 1998**, Serb forces began shelling the place and the entire family hid under the trailer. The baby Adriana was in her cradle. A shell fell near them, wounding Adriana's grandfather. Very soon afterwards, another exploded. Adriana was wounded in the neck by shrapnel and died within a short time. She was buried the same day at the cemetery in Obiliq/Obilić, where she lies to this day.
