Hysen (Murat) Hajrizi

(born 9/08/1931, Albanian from Balincë/Balinace, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, farmer, nine children)

On 19 September 1998, the command of the Yugoslav Army's Priština Corps issued an order to support Ministry of the Interior forces in dispersing and destroying KLA forces on the slopes of Mount **Çiçavicë/Čičavica**, including the village of Ballincë/Balinace. Hysen's numerous family fled the village with the other inhabitants, but he remained behind. On that day, battles between Serb forces and the KLA broke out around the village. On **23 September 1998**, Hysen's son Murat came to the village [**Balincë/Balinace**]. Murat and his comrades [KLA soldiers] brought some wounded with them, whom they left with Hysen when his son returned to his unit next day with the rest of the soldiers. When the Serb forces withdrew from the village on 24 September 1998, Murat came back home. He found the family home burnt down and his father's mutilated body lying about 100 metres from the house. He buried him the same day at the village cemetery. After the war, in July 1999, Hysen's body was removed to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants and War Victims in Oshlan/Ošljane. In late August 2000, pathologists of the ICTY exhumed Hysen's body to ascertain the cause of death. On 26 September 2000, the body was returned to the family and laid to rest at the same spot.

Ismet (Jetish) Haliti

(born 10/03/1943, Albanian from Balincë/Balinace, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, worker, nine children, member of KLA)

In July 1998, Ismet and his son Agim joined the KLA Staff HQ in the neighbouring village of Oshlan/Ošljane. When Serb forces began to close in on the village on 20 September 1998, some of the family fled from **Balincë/Balinace**, but Ismet, his sons Agim, Sabit and Fadil and his wife Miradije remained. Two days later, Fadil and Miradije also left the village. Immediately afterwards, Ismet, Sabit and Agim went to hide in the nearby woods. Next day [**23 September 1998**], Ismet set out to check on the house. He did not return. When the Serb forces had withdrawn from the village, local people found Ismet's burnt body in the hay, near the house of Arif Haliti. They buried him at the village cemetery. After the war, in July 1999, his mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants and War Victims in Oshlan/Ošljane. Pathologists from the ICTY exhumed it in 2000. Following an autopsy, the family laid Ismet's mortal remains to rest at the same cemetery.

Liridon (Sadik) Asllani

(born 15/11/1996, Albanian from Makërma/Makrmal, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality)

Little Liridon fled Makërma/Makrmal for the first time with his parents Sadik and Miradije, his brother Valmir, grandfather Sokol and grandmother Miradije in March 1998, after the killing of the Jashari family [see records]. They returned from Montenegro in early September 1998, but by 8 September the entire family had fled to Galicë/Galica. There they were taken in by Hasan Haxha. When Serb forces attacked Galicë/Galica on 22 September 1998, the Asllani family fled to the woods above the village on Mount **Çiçavicë/Čičavica**, together with the local inhabitants and refugees. Two days later, **23 September 1998** Serb forces shelled the woods above **Galicë/Galica**. A shell fell near Liridon, killing him instantly.
