

His family carried the body with them until the Serb forces withdrew on 26 September 1998, when they buried him at the cemetery in Galicë/Galica, where he lies to this day.

Haradin (Islam) Lahu

(born 19/08/1954, Albanian from Galicë/Galica, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, worker, five children)

Enver (Mete) Kastrati

(born 12/04/1958, Albanian from Poluzhë/Poluža, Glllogoc/Glogovac municipality, worker, two children, member of KLA)

The inhabitants of Galicë/Galica, Haradin's family among them, left the village on 21 September 1998. Haradin remained behind with his brother Agim, but as Serb forces were approaching the village, they also left shortly afterwards. Haradin went to the neighbouring village of Beçiq/Bečić, from where he set off home again to **Galicë/Galica** on **23 September 1998** with his brother-in-law Enver, a member of the KLA. They were never seen again alive. When the Serb forces had withdrawn, Haradin's relative, Sabit Lahu, and a friend, Haxhi Misni, found their bodies in the woods above the village. They were buried at the cemetery in Galicë/Galica. After the war, in November 1999, Enver's mortal remains were removed together with the body of his brother Bajram to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Polac/Poļance [Skënderaj/Srbica municipality]. In late October of 2009, Kosovo pathologists exhumed their mortal remains and, following identification, their families finally laid them to rest.

Vesel (Sejdi) Muharremi

(born 3/11/1956, Albanian from Mikushnicë/Mikušnica, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, metal worker, three children, member of KLA)

Vesel was the head of the Muharremi extended family in the village of Mikushnicë/Mikušnica. The families of his brothers Cene and Zymer, and the family of his brother Adem, who was working in Slovenia, all lived in the same household. On 16 June 1998, Vesel joined the KLA and was part of the village guard. On 17 September 1998, he left with his entire family, because Serb forces had entered the neighbouring village of Prekaz i Epërm/Gornje Prekaze [Skënderaj/Srbica municipality]. They drove by tractor to the woods on Mount **Çiçavicë/Čičavica**, above **Rezik/Resnik** village. The next day, the women and children came back to hide in the village mosque, whilst Vesel and his brothers remained in the woods. On **23 September 1998**, when the Serb infantry entered the woods, Vesel was killed in the fighting. Cene, Zymer and his nephew Fatmir found his body the same evening and covered it with a blanket. When the situation had calmed down on 29 September 1998, they went back for the body and buried Vesel at the cemetery in Mikushnicë/Mikušnica.

Lutfi (Rexhep) Hyseni

(born 10/01/1932, Albanian from Oshlan/Ošljane, Vushtrri/Vučitrn municipality, pensioner, six children)

Until his retirement, Lutfi worked at the *Trepča* Mining Complex. When the attack on the Mount **Çiçavicë/Čičavica** zone by Serb forces began on 22 September 1998, he decided to remain at home [**Oshlan/Ošljane**]. That was the last time his family saw him alive. Four days later, his son Bajram heard from a members of the KLA that Lutfi had been killed on **24 September 1998**. Bajram went to the village the same day. He found the house burnt and Lutfi's body in the yard. He had numerous bullet wounds to his body. With the help of members of the KLA, Bajram buried him in a meadow near the cemetery. When they returned in July 1999, the family removed Lutfi's body to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants and War Victims
