

Nikola (Stojan) Vujičić

(born 13/10/1970, Serb from Zrenjanin, two children, member of VJ)

Nikola finished the Military Academy. He fought in the war in Bosnia and Herzegovina. In Kosovo, he served as a platoon commander and deputy commander of a Military Police company. Milorad was chief of the Police Station in Vrbas, where Gojko also worked as a traffic policeman. Zdravko worked at Novi Sad Police Department, and Dragoljub at Pančevo Police Department.

On the morning of **15 August 1998**, Milorad, Gojko, Zdravko, Dragoljub and Nikola went on a reconnaissance mission in the outskirts of **Voksh/Vokša**. Members of the Yugoslav Army fired two tank shells at them by mistake. The first one missed them, but the second one killed them on the spot.

Milorad and Gojko were buried alongside each other in the cemetery in Vrbas. Zdravko was buried on 17 August 1998 in the cemetery Nova Gajdobra. Dragoljub was buried the same day in the New Cemetery in Pančevo.

Sefer (Ahmet) Mehmeti

(born 27/09/1916, Albanian from Brovinë/Brovina, Gjakovë/Đakovica municipality, forest worker, three children)

Sefer and Nifa lived with their sons, Bashkim and Bekim, and daughter, Kosovare, in the village of Brovinë/Brovina. Before the summer of 1998, they moved to the village of Gjocaj/Đocaj and settled into the vacant house of Sefer's cousins. Bekim joined the KLA, whilst the elderly Sefer and Nifa stayed with their daughter and other son. After a short while, Nifa was wounded during the shelling of the village by Serb forces. On **18 August 1998**, Serb forces moved into **Gjocaj/Đocaj**. Bashkim carried his mother out of the house and placed her in a field beside the

house. Because of the shooting, he could not go back for his father. During the next three days, Nifa hid with her son and daughter before leaving for Albania with the assistance of the KLA. A month later, Sefer's brother Jahë Mehmeti joined them in Albania. He told Nifa and her children that he had been informed by some local residents of Brovinë/Brovina that Sefer had been killed by Serb forces on 18 August 1998, the day they entered the village, and that his body was held at the morgue of the Prishtinë/Priština Hospital. A Sefer's brother's son had recovered Sefer's body and buried him in the cemetery in his native village of Brovinë/Brovina.

Haxhi (Rexhep) Krasniqi

(born 6/11/1964, Albanian from Prapaqan/Papraçane, Dečan/Dečani municipality, entrepreneur, one child, member of KLA)

When Serb forces shelled the village [**Prapaqan/Papraçane**] on **20 August 1998** Haxhi was in the yard with his wife Slavica and brother Haki. They were standing by a lorry whose engine was running, and because of its noise they could not hear that shelling had started. One shell went off near them, leaving Haxhi and his brother severely injured. Some fragments of a shell had hit Haxhi in the chest. He died four hours later. Later that day, his wife had him buried in the village cemetery, with the help of some villagers.
