

were transported to the Forensic Medicine Institute of the Clinical Centre in Prishtinë/Priština. The village was kept under blockade until 15:00h [1 March 1998]. Xhevdet entered the Ahmeti family compound in the afternoon, after 15:00h. On the bushes outside the yard he found broken teeth, locks of hair and blood. In the evening of 1 March 1998, he learned from Kadri Gjeli that the bodies of the Ahmetis and that of Behram were in the morgue in Prishtinë/Priština. The bodies were mutilated. The Ahmetis and Behram Fazliu were buried on 3 March 1998 in the cemetery in Likoshan/Likošane.

Xhemshir (Sefer) Nebihi

(born 1966, Albanian from Qirez/Čirez, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, farmer, four children)

Rukije (Xhezair Morina) Nebihi

(born 1972, Albanian woman from Qirez/Čirez, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, two children)

Xhemshir and Hamide lived with their four children, Xhemshir's parents Sefer and Hate, and brothers Ilir and Zahir. Zahir was married to Rukije, who was noticeably pregnant. When shooting broke out on **28 February 1998** around 11:30h, in Likoshan/Likošane and **Qirez/Čirez**, the entire family were at home except Ilir, who had gone over to their neighbour Sejdiu to check out what was going on [see record below]. Two helicopters came in from Likoshan/Likošane and flew down low, shooting at the house of the Nebihi family. Zahir hid himself in the attic of their newly constructed house, while the other family members went to the old house. Two or three hours later, nine policemen broke into the yard, shooting at the old house. They broke the windows and started yelling at the people

in the house to get out. Sefer answered that they had children with them and nothing to hide, whereupon a policeman shot and wounded him. As Rukije moved towards Sefer in order to help him, three policemen entered the room and shot her in the head, killing her instantly. The same policemen then shot Xhemshir dead.

The bodies of Rukije and Xhemshir remained in the house until 3 March 1998, when they were buried in the cemetery in Likoshan/Likošane, alongside other victims and men killed in the fighting.

Bedri (Sheremet) Sejdiu

Nazmi (Sheremet) Sejdiu

(born 1974, Albanian from Qirez/Čirez, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, chemist)

Bekim (Sheremet) Sejdiu

(born 1975, Albanian from Qirez/Čirez, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality)

Beqir (Brahim) Rexhepi

(born 16/03/1968, Albanian from Qirez/Čirez, Skënderaj/Srbica municipality, car mechanic, three children, member of KLA)

The brothers Beqir, Nazmi, Bedri and Bekim lived with their mother Abide in **Qirez/Čirez**. Their father Sheremet had died before the war. Beqir was married to Shukrije and had two children with her. On the morning of **28 February 1998**, Beqir, Bedri, Nazmi, Bekim and Beqir's little son Besnik went to their field. At around 11:30h they could hear a shoot-out coming from the direction of the neighbouring village of Likoshan/Likošane, so they went back
