

Sami served as a cook with the KLA. He would regularly leave the Brigade to visit his family. On **29 May 1998**, he went to see his family, unaware of the fact that they had fled the village. At the spot known as *Fushë e Vukovcit/Vukovačka polja (Vukovc Fields) [Vukovc/Vukovce]*, he encountered some members of Serb forces who opened fire at him. Sami died instantly. Three days later, on 1 June 1998, his fellow combatants buried him in the cemetery in Llapushnik/Lapušnik. On 5 September 2000, his mortal remains were transferred to the Cemetery for Fallen Combatants in Negroc/Negrovce.

On **31 May 1998**, around 13:00h, a group of one hundred policemen with armoured vehicles entered **Poklek i Ri/Novi Poklek** from the direction of *Feronikl* factory in Gllgoc/Glogovac. First they surrounded the village, shooting at the houses; later, they started raiding the houses, driving the people they found there out into the streets. They drove Sahit, Ferat, Blerim, Safer, Muhamet, Hajriz, Ramë and Ahmet and their families out into the main street, frisked them and then ordered them to get into Sahit's house. They also brought there the eighteen-year-old Ardian, who had attempted to run away with his brothers after the police stormed the village, and Fidai, who had earlier that morning left Vasilevë/Vasiljevo for Gllgoc/Glogovac in order to see a doctor. Approximately 60 women and children and 10 men were forced out of their homes. One woman saw a killed policeman. The police separated the men from the women and children and ordered the women and children to go to the neighbouring village of Vasilevë/Vasiljevo. Before long, Blerim's father Brahim, who
