

family took shelter in the *Malet e Berishës/Berišine planine (Berisha's Mountains)* [Malishevë/Mališevo municipality] until 20 September 1998. When they returned home, Hisen was not there. They found his body near the village at the spot called *Azemiçe*, and buried it later that day in the cemetery of the *Bujupi* neighbourhood. After the war, in September 2001, the Bujupis transferred Hisen's remains to the Cemetery for War Victims in Arllat/Orlate.

Lulzim (Mehmet) Bujupi

(born 8/12/1961, Albanian from Arllat/Orlate, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, teacher)

Lulzim was a history teacher at the primary school in Glogoc/Glogovac. When Serb forces attacked Arllat/Orlate on **26 July 1998**, his family, along with other villagers, fled to the *Malet e Berishës/Berišine planine (Berisha's Mountains)* [Malishevë/Mališevo municipality], but Lulzim stayed at home [Arllat/Orlate]. Lulzim's parents and the rest of his family returned to the village after the war, on 14 June 1999. Lulzim was no longer there. It was not until 11 October 2005 that the Bujupis were informed by the Forensic Medicine Institute in Rahovec/Orahovac that Lulzim's mortal remains had been found in June 2003 in Prishtinë/Prishtina's Dragodan cemetery and positively identified. On 14 October 2005, the Bujupis recovered Lulzim's mortal remains and buried him in the *Bujupi* neighbourhood cemetery in Arllat/Orlate.

Dalip (Smail) Bytyqi

(born 13/11/1928, Albanian from Arllat/Orlate, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, construction worker, four children)

Dalip did not want to leave home when the villagers, including his family members, left Arllat/Orlate on **26 July 1998**, in flight from Serb forces. His family knew nothing about Dalip's fate until they returned home on 15

January 1999, to find his charred body inside the house among the remains of burnt car tires. Later that day, the family buried Dalip in the *Bytyqi* neighbourhood cemetery in Arllat/Orlate.

Zeqir (Bajram) Gashi

(born 20/12/1913, Albanian from Llapushnik/Lapušnik, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, six children)

The aged Zeqir stayed behind in **Llapushnik/Lapušnik** after 26 July 1998, when the civilians fled into the *Malet e Berishës/Berišine planine (Berisha's Mountains)* [Malishevë/Mališevo municipality] because of clashes between Serb forces and the KLA. Four days later, on **30 July 1998**, Zeqir's son Avdi and several of his cousins sneaked their way to Zeqir's house in order to talk him into coming with them. Zeqir refused to do so. The next day, on 31 July 1998, Avdi saw from the mountain Serb forces enter the *Gashi* neighbourhood and start torching the houses. On 2 August 1998, some KLA members found Zeqir's burnt body in the house, surrounded by many spent bullet casings. Later that day, Zeqir's body was buried by his family members in the *Malet e Berishës/Berišine planine*. After the war, on 9 June 2000, Zeqir's mortal remains were transferred to the cemetery in Llapushnik/Lapušnik.

(born 3/05/1945, Albanian woman from Shtuticë/Štutica, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, seven children)

(born 20/05/1962, Albanian from Shtuticë/Štutica, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality, farmer)

Kada (Miftar) Zeqiri

(born 1/05/1965, Albanian woman from Shtuticë/Štutica, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality),

Vahide (Miftar) Zeqiri

(born 2/07/1977, Albanian woman from Shtuticë/Štutica, Glogoc/Glogovac municipality)
